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## **Crochet Stitch Guide**

## Before You Begin

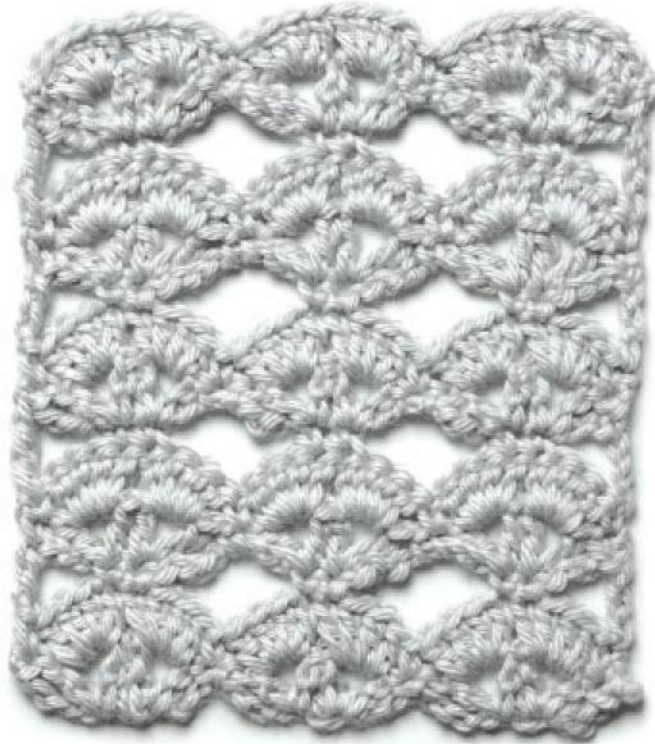
Unlike most crochet patterns, those in this book specify no gauge, no material requirements and no hook sizes.

That is because each stitch can be worked in your choice of yarn to vary the size and appearance of each stitch to fit your project.

The photos show Swatch 42 ([page 47](#)) worked in 3 different weights of yarn and 3 different hook sizes. You can see how the yarn will change the look of the stitch.

#### **#5 BULKY WITH J HOOK**

When choosing the material and hook for your project, you may wish to do some experimenting with a variety of materials until you achieve the appearance and texture that pleases you.

The stitch patterns photographed throughout this book were all made with worsted-weight yarn and a size I aluminum hook.

Working directly into afghan edge, single crochet edging is worked directly into the crochet fabric. Work one or more rounds of single crochet edging right around you afghan.

Begin by holding the afghan with right side facing you. Make a row of single crochet stitches into the edge, spacing the stitches evenly all the way around the afghan. Work 3 stitches into each corner or chain 2 for corner, join round with slip stitch into first single crochet.

## Multiples

A multiple is the number of chains required for each repeat of the stitch pattern; to this we may then add a specified number of chains to make the pattern end correctly.

If a pattern specifies a multiple of 6 plus 2, for example, you need to make a starting chain in multiples of 6 (12, 18, 24, etc): then add a final 2 chains. The number of chains given after plus in a multiple is added only once.

**Helpful Hint:** When working a long foundation chain, add a few extra chains to ensure that the first row of the pattern will not run out of chains; then at the end of the first row, rip out any extra chains.



## SWATCHES 1–47

### Swatch 1



#### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color of yarn.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 10 plus 6.

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 4 chs, [hdc in each of next 5 chs, sl st in each of next 5 chs] across, turn.

**Row 2:** Remainder of piece is worked in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st in each of first 5 sl sts, [hdc in each of next 5 hdc, sl st in each of next 5 sl sts] across, turn.

**Row 3: Ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each of next 4 sl sts, [sl st in each of next 5 hdc, hdc in each of next 5 sl sts] across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 4 hdc, [sl st in each of next 5 sl sts, hdc in each of next 5 hdc] across, turn.

**Row 5:** Sl st in each of first 5 hdc, [hdc in each of next 5 sl sts, sl st in each of next 5 hdc] across, turn.

Rep rows 2–5 for pattern to desired length. At end of last row, **do not turn.**  
Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 2



### PATTERN NOTE

Made with 3 colors.

### SPECIAL STITCHES

**Long double crochet (lng dc):** Yo, insert hook in next sc 2 rows below, yo, pull up lp even with working row, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

**Extended long double crochet (ext lng dc):** Yo, insert hook in next sc 3 rows below, yo, pull up lp even with working row, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** With first color, ch multiple of 33 plus 32.

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 14 chs, 3 sc in next ch, sc in each of next 15 chs, [sk next 2 chs, sc in each of next 15 chs, 3 sc in next ch, sc in each of next 15 chs] across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each of next 15 sc, 3 sc in next sc, [sc in each of next 15 sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in each of next 15 sc, 3 sc in next sc] across to last 16 sc, sc in each of next 14 sc, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn.

**Rows 3 & 4:** Rep row 2. At end of row 4, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to 2nd color by pulling lp through. Fasten off first color.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sk first sc, \*sc in next sc, **lng dc** (see *Special Stitches*), [sc in next sc, **ext lng dc** (see *Special Stitches*), sc in next sc, lng dc] 3 times, sc in next sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in next sc, lng dc, [sc in next sc, ext lng dc, sc in next sc, lng dc] 3 times\*\*, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each of next 15 sts, 3 sc in next sc, [sc in each of next 15 sts, sk next 2 sts, sc in each of next 15 sts, 3 sc in next sc] across to last 16 sts, sc in each of next 14 sts, sk next sc, sc in last sc, changing colors to first color in last st, turn. Fasten off 2nd color.

**Rows 7–10:** Rep row 2. At end of last row, change to 3rd color. Fasten off first color.

**Rows 11 & 12:** Rep rows 5 and 6. At end of last row, change to first color. Fasten off 3rd color.

**Row 13:** Rep row 2.

Rep rows 2–13 for pattern to desired length, ending last rep with row 10. At end of last row, fasten off. ■

## Swatch 3



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCHES

**Cluster (cl):** Holding back last lp of each dc on hook, 2 dc in next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

**Front post cluster (fpcl):** Holding back last lp of each dc on hook, 2 **fpdc** (see [Stitch Guide](#)) around next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

**Back post cluster (bpcl):** Holding back last lp of each dc on hook, 2 **bpdc** (see [Stitch Guide](#)) around next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 6 plus 3.

**Row 1 (RS):** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in 6th ch from hook (*first 5 chs count as first dc, sk 2 chs*), [sk next 2 chs, **cl** (*see [Special Stitches](#)*) in next ch, sk next 2 chs, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch] across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn.

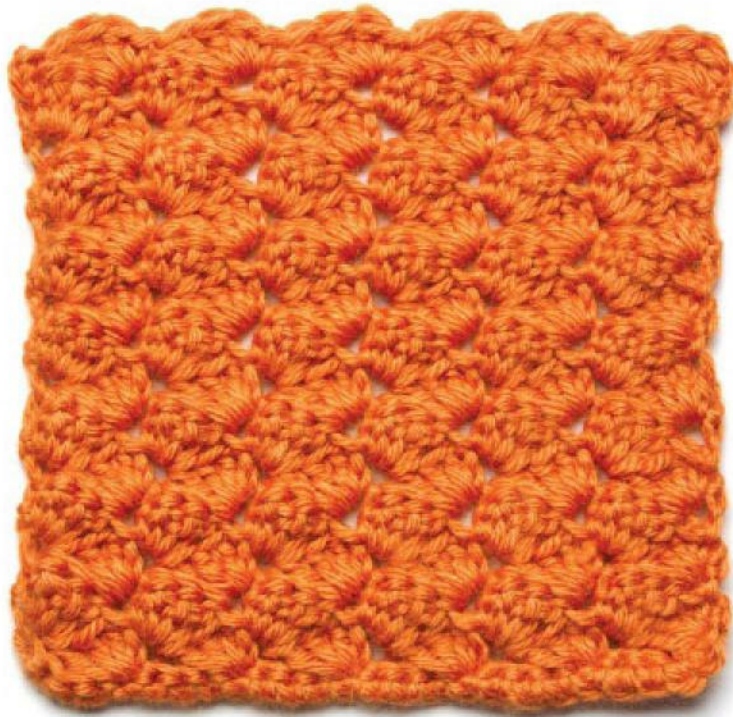
**Row 2: Ch 3** (*see [Pattern Notes](#)*), [(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, **bpcl** (*see [Special Stitches](#)*) around next cl] across to last ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in last ch-2 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in 5th ch of beg 5 chs, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, [(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, **fpcl** (*see [Special Stitches](#)*) around next bpcl] across to last ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in last ch-2 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, [(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp, bpcl around next fpcl] across to last ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in last ch-2 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in last st, turn.

Rep rows 3 and 4 for pattern to desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 4



### PATTERN NOTE

Made with 1 color.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 8 plus 2.

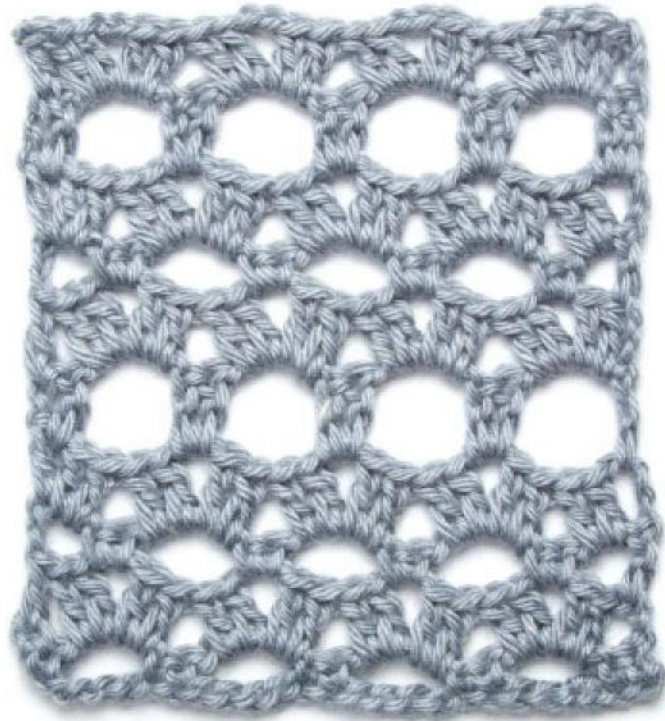
**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, (sc, 3 dc) in first sc, [sk next 3 sc, (sc, 3 dc) in next sc] across to last 4 sc, sk next 3 sc, sc in last sc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, (sc, 3 dc) in first sc, [sk next 3 dc, (sc, 3 dc) in next sc] across to last sc, sc in last sc, turn.

Rep row 3 for pattern to desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 5



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 6 plus 3.



**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, sc in each of next 2 chs] across, turn.

**Row 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-4 sp and in each ch-4 sp across to last 2 sc, sk next sc, dc in last sc, turn.

**Row 3: Ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] across, ch 2, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 4: Ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in each ch-4 sp across to last ch sp, 2 dc in last ch sp, ch 1, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 4, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 4] across to last ch-1 sp, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 3, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in each ch-4 sp across to last 2 dc, sk next dc, dc in last st, turn.

Rep rows 3–6 consecutively for pattern to desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 6



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Cluster (cl):** Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 2 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 3 plus 6.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 4th ch from hook (*first 3 chs count as first dc*) and in each ch across, turn.

**Row 2: Ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in each st across, turn.

**Row 3: Ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in same hdc as beg ch-3, ch 3, **cl** (*see Special Stitch*) in top of dc just made, sk next hdc, [**dc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 3 hdc, ch 3, cl in top of dc dec just made] across to last 2 hdc, dc dec in last 2 hdc, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, [3 dc in top of next dc dec] across to last st, 2 dc in last st, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, hdc in each dc across, turn.

Rep rows 3–6 consecutively for pattern to desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 7



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 3 colors.

Color sequence: 2 rows of each color ending with 2 rows of first color.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** With first color, ch multiple of 24 plus 26.

Foundation ch of at least 50 is necessary to work sample swatch.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 5th ch from hook and in each of next 3 chs, [2 dc in next ch, dc in next ch] 6 times, \*dc in each of next 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, dc in each of next 4 chs, [2 dc in next ch, dc in next ch] 6 times, rep from \* across to last 6 chs, dc in each of next 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 2, sk next 3 dc, working in **back lps** (see [Stitch Guide](#)), dc in each of

next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, \*dc in each of next 3 dc, sk next 3 dc, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc, sk next 3 dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, rep from \* across to last 6 dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, sk last 3 dc, dc in next ch of beg 4 chs, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to next color by pulling lp through, turn. Fasten off first color.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, sk next 3 dc, working in back lps, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, \*dc in each of next 3 dc, sk next 3 dc, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next fpdc, sk next st on this row behind bpdc, sk next 3 dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, rep from \* across to last 6 dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, sk last 3 dc, dc in 2nd ch of turning ch-2, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, sk next 3 dc, working in back lps, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, \*dc in each of next 3 dc, sk next 3 dc, fpdc around next bpdc, sk next st on this row behind fpdc, sk next 3 dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, rep from \* across to last 6 dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, sk last 3 dc, dc in 2nd ch of turning ch-2, change to next color by pulling lp through, turn. Fasten off 2nd color

Working in **color sequence** (see *Pattern Notes*), rep rows 3 and 4 alternately for desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 8



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 8 plus 3.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 3rd ch from hook (*first 2 chs count as first dc*) and in each ch across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 2 (*see Pattern Notes*), [**fpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around each of next 4 dc, **bpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around each of next 4 dc] across, ending with dc in last st, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, bpdc around next st, fpdc around each of next 4 sts, [bpdc around each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last 4 sts, bpdc around each of next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, fpdc around each of next 2 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts, [fpdc around each of next 4 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts] to last 3 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 2, bpdc around each of next 3 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts, [bpdc around each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last 2 sts, bpdc around next st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, [bpdc around each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 2, fpdc around next st, bpdc around each of next 4 sts, [fpdc around each of next 4 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 2, bpdc around each of next 2 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts, [bpdc around each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last 3 sts, bpdc around each of next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 2, fpdc around each of next 3 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts, [fpdc around each of next 4 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last 2 sts, fpdc around next st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 10:** Ch 2, [fpdc around each of next 4 sts, bpdc around each of next 4 sts] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

Rep rows 3–10 consecutively for desired length. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 9



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Bobble:** Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 5 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 12 plus 6.

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in each of next 11 chs] across to last 3 chs, ch 1, sk next ch, sc in each of last 2 chs, turn.



**Row 2:** Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in next sc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 11 sts] across to last ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk last ch-1 sp, dc in each of last 2 sc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc, **bobble** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, [ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 7 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 3 sts, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 7 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts] to last sc, dc in last sc, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 3 dc on this row] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 5 sts, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 7 sts] across to last 2 ch-1 sps, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of last 6 sts, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 6 dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 7 dc on this row] across to last 2 ch-1 sps 2 rows below, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of last 6 sts on this row, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 7 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, [dc in each of next 11 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp] across to last 8 sts, dc in each of last 8 sts, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 6 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 7 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc] across to last ch-1 sp 2 rows below, bobble in last ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of last 6 dc, turn.

**Row 10:** Rep row 6.

**Row 11:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 3 dc on this row, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 12:** Rep row 4.

**Row 13:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 7 dc on this row, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc] across to last dc, sc in last dc, turn.

**Row 14:** Rep row 2.

**Next rows:** Rep rows 3–14 consecutively for desired length.

**Last row:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 11 dc on this row] across to last ch-1 sp 2 rows below, bobble in last ch-1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of last 2 dc on this row. Fasten off. ■

## Swatch 10



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 6 plus 3.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 3rd ch from hook (*first 2 chs count as first dc*) and in each ch across, turn.

**Row 2:** **Ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), [**fpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 dc, **bpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 dc] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, [fpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, [bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 2, [bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, fpdc around each of next 3 bpdc] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, [fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

Rep rows 3–6 consecutively for pattern to desired length, ending with row 3. At end of last row, fasten off. ■

## Swatch 11



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Circle:** 6 fpdc around next dc, turn piece upside down, 6 fpdc around previous dc on same row.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 10 plus 1.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 3rd ch from hook (*first 2 chs count as first dc*) and in each ch across, turn.

**Row 2: Ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each dc across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 4 dc, work **circle** (*see Special Stitch*), [working behind circle, dc in top of same dc as beg part of circle made and in each of next 9 dc, work circle] across to last 5 sts, dc in top of same dc as beg part of circle made and in each of last 4 sts, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, dc in each st across, turn.

**Rows 5 & 6:** Rep row 4.

**Row 7:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 9 dc, work circle, [working behind circle, dc in top of same dc as beg part of circle made and in each of next 9 dc, work circle] across to last 10 sts, working behind circle, dc in top of same dc as beg part of circle made and in each of last 9 dc, turn.

**Rows 8–10:** Rep row 4.

Rep rows 3–10 consecutively for pattern to desired length, ending with row 4. At end of last row, fasten off. ■

## Swatch 12



### PATTERN NOTES

Made with 1 color.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) as indicated in instructions.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation ch:** Ch multiple of 16 plus 18.

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 5, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch] across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 4, (*counts as first dc and ch-2*), sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-

5 sp, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, \*[sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 3 times, sc in next ch-5 sp, shell in next sc, rep from \* across to last 2 ch-5 sps, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in last ch-5 sp, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn.

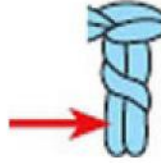

- Sizes H/8/5mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



## GAUGE

**Size H hook:** 7 sts = 2 inches; 3 dc and 1 sc row = 2 inches

**Size I hook:** 3 sts = 1 inch; 4 sc rows = 1 inch; 5 hdc rows = 2 inches; 5 dc rows = 3 inches; 1 tr row = 1 inch

Each Block is 9½ inches square

## PATTERN NOTES

Because there are a variety of pattern stitches used in this Afghan, some squares may tend to roll or look distorted when completed. To ensure that all squares are the same size, place each square over a clean double-folded terry-cloth bath towel and pin to measure 9½ inches square. Lightly mist or spray each square with water and allow to dry. Be sure to use only rust-proof pins. When dry, label each square with the appropriate number for easier assembly.

Use I hook unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### AFGHAN SQUARES

Work 30 Squares using Swatches 48–77.

### ASSEMBLY

Holding Squares with WS tog, matching sts, sew tog through **back lps** (see [Stitch Guide](#)) in 5 rows of 6 Squares each according to Assembly Diagram.

**Rows 7 & 8:** Rep rows 3 and 4.

**Row 9:** Rep row 3.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 sc, [berry st in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] across to last 5 sts, berry st in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, turn.

**Row 11:** Rep row 3.

**Row 12:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sc, \*[berry st in next sc, sc in next sc, berry st in next sc\*, sc in each of next 5 sc, rep between \* once] across to last 7 sts, sc in each of last 7 sc, turn.

**Row 13:** Rep row 3.

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 6 sc,  $\diamond$ \*[berry st in next sc, sc in next sc] twice, berry st in next sc\*, sc in each of next 3 sc, rep between \* once, rep from  $\diamond$  across to last 6 sts, sc in each of last 6 sc, turn.

**Row 15:** Rep row 3.

**Row 16:** Rep row 12.

**Row 17:** Rep row 3.

**Row 18:** Rep row 10.

**Rows 19–25:** Rep rows 3–9.

**Rows 26 & 27:** Rep rows 2 and 3. At the end of row 27, **do not fasten off**.

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sc, \*fpdc around next fpdc dec\*\*, sc in each

**Rows 15–25:** Rep rows 3–13.

Ch 1, working along left edge, [sc in top of next dc, sc around post of same dc] 11 times, sc in edge of row 1, working across opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in each of next 23 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working along right edge, sc in edge of row 1, [sc around post of next dc, sc in top of same dc] 11 times, working along top edge, 3 sc in first st, sc in each of next 23 sts, 3 sc in last st, join in first sc. 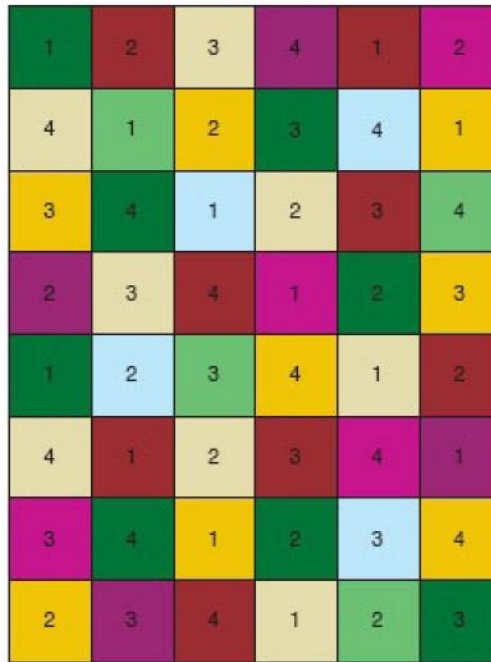

**Rnd 2:** With RS facing, join 2nd color in any corner ch sp, [ch 1, sc in side of last sc] 3 times, counting corner ch sps as 1 st, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st,

\*drop lp from hook, working on front side of work, insert hook in 2nd sk st, pull dropped lp through, ch 1, **curve st** (see *Special Stitch*) in same st, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st, rep from \* around, ending last st in same sp as first st behind first curve st. Fasten off. ■

# BASICS

## LESSON 1: Getting Started

To crochet, you need only a crochet hook, some yarn and a tapestry needle.

### YARN

Yarn comes in many sizes, from fine crochet cotton used for doilies, to wonderful bulky mohairs used for afghans and sweaters. The most commonly used yarn is medium (or worsted) weight. It is readily available in a wide variety of beautiful colors. This is the weight we will use in our lessons.

Always read yarn labels carefully. The label will tell you how many ounces, grams, meters and/or yards are in the skein or ball of yarn. Read the label to find out the fiber content of the yarn, its washability, and sometimes, how to pull the yarn from the skein. Also, there is usually a dye-lot number on the label. This number assures you that the color of each skein with this number is the same. Yarn of the same color name may vary in shade somewhat from dye lot to dye lot, creating variations in color when a project is completed. Therefore, when purchasing yarn for a project, it is important to match the dye-lot numbers on the skeins. You'll need a blunt-pointed sewing needle with an eye big enough to carry the yarn for weaving in yarn ends and sewing seams. This is a size 16 steel tapestry needle. You can buy big plastic needles called yarn needles, but they are not as good as the steel.

### HOOKS

Crochet hooks come in many sizes, from very fine steel hooks, used to make intricate doilies and lace, to very large ones of plastic or wood, used to make bulky sweaters or rugs.

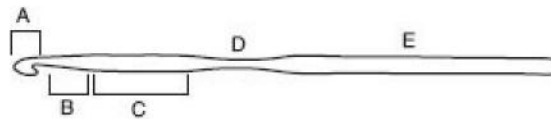
The hooks you will use most often are made of aluminum, are about 6 inches long and are sized alphabetically by letter from B (*smallest*) to K. For our



lessons, you'll need a size H hook, which is considered a medium-sized hook.

The aluminum crochet hook looks like this:

In [Fig. 1](#): (A) is the hook end, which is used to hook the yarn and draw it through other loops of yarn (*called stitches*); (B) is the throat, a shaped area that helps you slide the stitch up onto (C) the working area; (D) is the fingerhold, a flattened area that helps you grip the hook comfortably, usually with your thumb and middle finger; and (E) is the handle, which rests under your fourth and little fingers and provides balance for easy, smooth work.

It is important that every stitch is made on the working area, never on the throat (*which would make the stitch too tight*) and never on the fingerhold (*which would stretch the stitch*).

The hook is held in the right hand, with the thumb and third finger on the fingerhold and the index finger near the tip of the hook ([Fig. 2](#)).

The hook should be turned slightly toward you, not facing up or down. [Fig. 3](#) shows how the hook is held, viewing from underneath the hand. The hook should be held firmly, but not tightly.

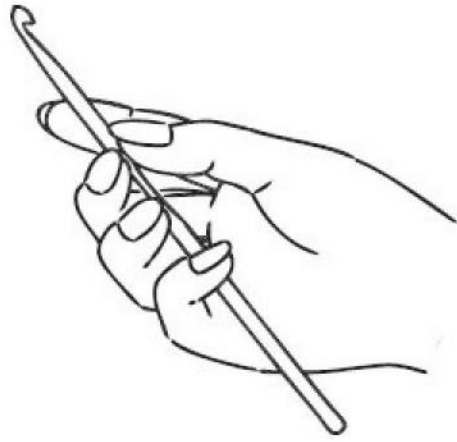

## LESSON 2: Chain Stitch (abbreviated ch)

Crochet usually begins with a series of chain stitches called a beginning or foundation chain. Begin by making a slip knot on the hook about 6 inches from the free end of the yarn. Loop the yarn as shown in [Fig. 4](#).

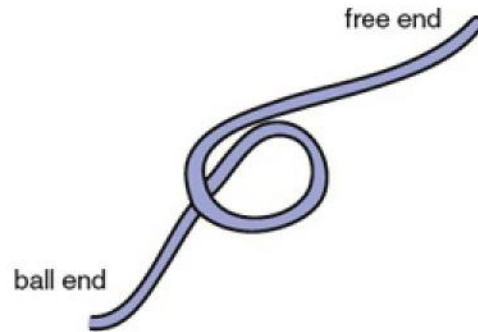

Insert the hook through center of loop and hook the free end ([Fig. 5](#)).

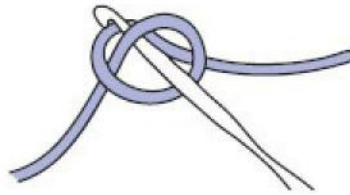

Pull this through and up onto the working area of the hook ([Fig. 6](#)).

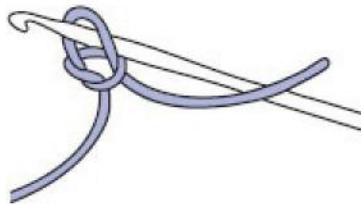


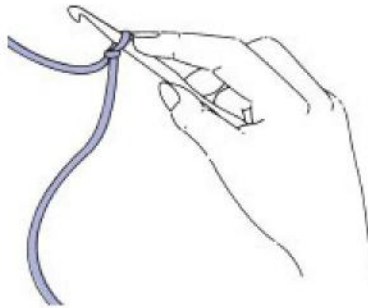

Pull the free yarn end to tighten the loop ([Fig. 7](#)).

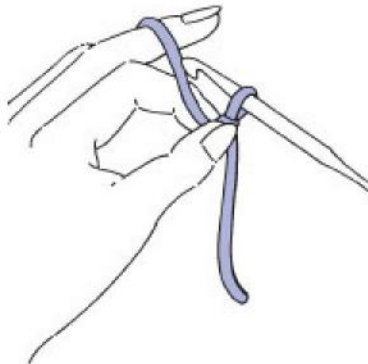
The loop on the hook should be firm, but loose enough to slide back and forth easily on the hook. Be sure you still have about a 6-inch yarn end. Hold the hook, now with its slip knot, in your right hand (*Fig. 8*).



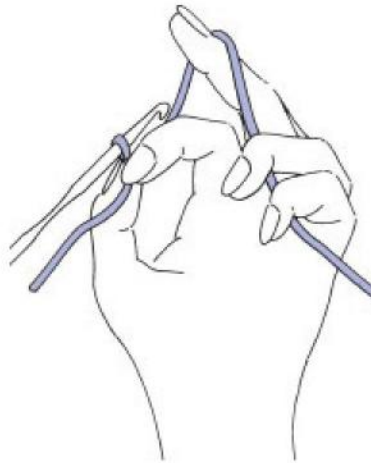

Now let's make the first chain stitch.

**Step 1:** Hold the base of the slip knot with the thumb and index finger of your left hand, and thread yarn from the skein over the middle finger (*Fig. 9*) and under the remaining fingers of the left hand (*Fig. 9a*).

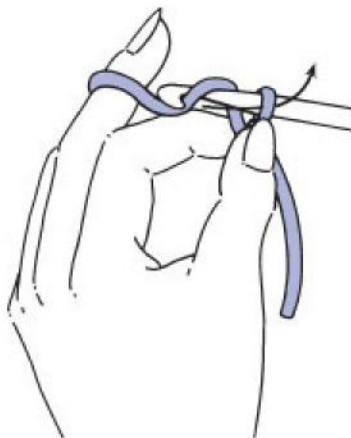

Your middle finger will stick up a bit to help the yarn feed smoothly from the skein/ball, and the other fingers help maintain an even tension on the yarn as you work.

**Hint:** As you practice, you can adjust the way your left hand holds the yarn to however is most comfortable for you.

**Step 2:** Bring the yarn over the hook from back to front and hook it (*Fig. 10*).

Draw hooked yarn through the loop of the slip knot on the hook and up onto the working area of the hook (see arrow on *Fig. 10*); you have now made one chain stitch (*Fig. 11*).

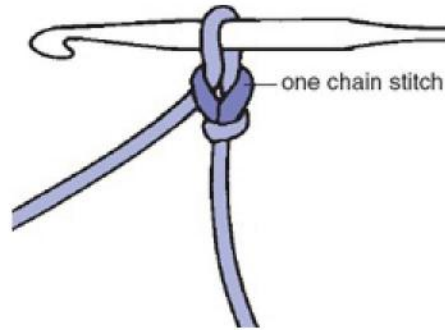

**Step 3:** Again bring the yarn over the hook from back to front (*Fig. 12a*).

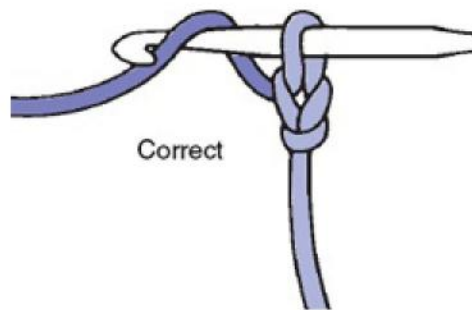

**Note:** Take care not to bring yarn from front to back (*Fig. 12b*).

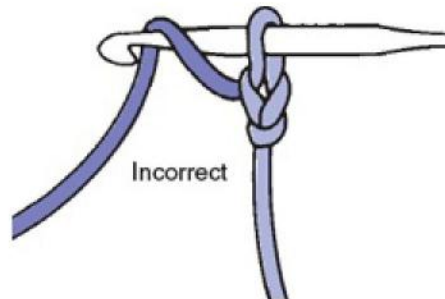
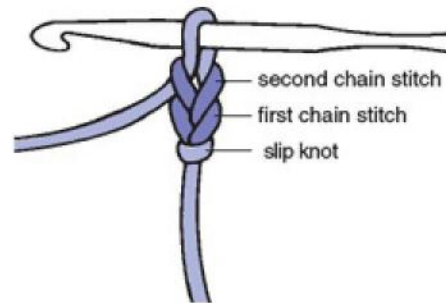


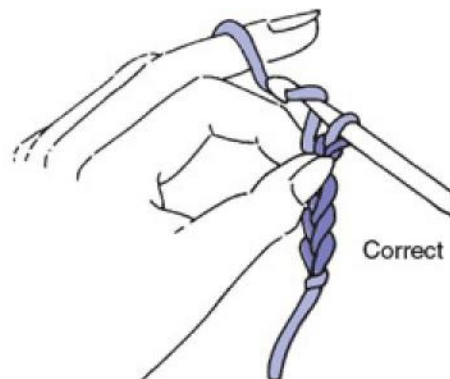

Hook it and draw through loop on the hook: You have made another chain stitch (*Fig. 13*).



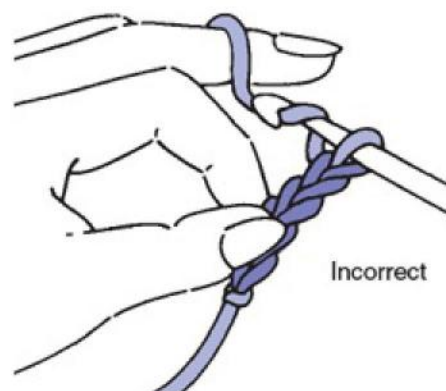

Repeat step 3 for each additional chain stitch, being careful to move the left thumb and index finger up the chain close to the hook after each new stitch or two (*Fig. 14a*). This helps you control the work.

**Note:** *Fig 14b* shows the incorrect way to hold the stitches.

Also, be sure to pull each new stitch up onto the working area of the hook.

The working yarn and the work in progress are always held in your left hand.

Practice making chains until you are comfortable with your grip of the hook and the flow of the yarn. In the beginning your work will be uneven, with some chain stitches loose and others tight. While you're learning, try to keep the chain stitches loose. As your skill increases, the chain should be firm, but not tight, with all chain stitches even in size.

**Hint:** As you practice, if the hook slips out of a stitch, don't get upset! Just insert the hook again from the front into the center of the last stitch taking care not to twist the loop (Fig. 15).

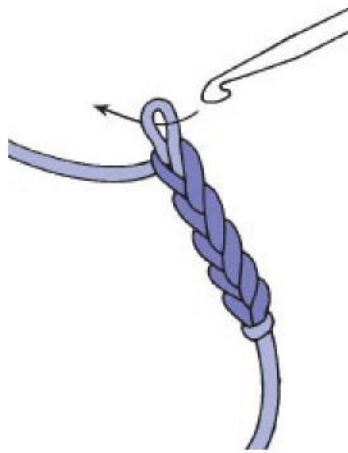

When you are comfortable with the chain stitch, draw your hook out of the last stitch and pull out the work back to the beginning. Now you've learned the important first step of crochet: the beginning chain.



## LESSON 3: Working Into the Chain

Once you have worked the beginning chain, you are ready to begin the stitches required to make any project. These stitches are worked into the foundation chain. For practice, make six chains loosely.

**Hint:** When counting your chain stitches at the start of a pattern—which you must do very carefully before continuing—note that the loop on the hook is never counted as a stitch, and the starting slip knot is never counted as a stitch (Fig. 16).

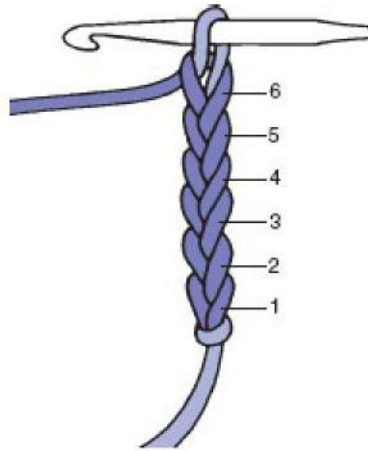
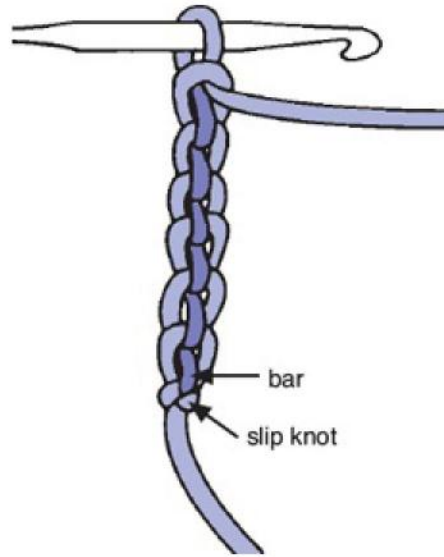

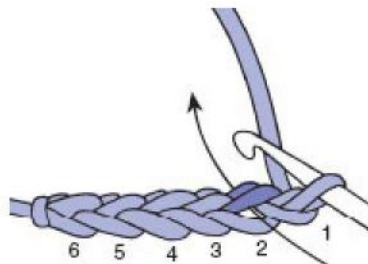
Now stop and look at the chain. The front looks like a series of interlocking “V’s” (Fig. 16), and each stitch has a bump or ridge at the back (Fig. 17).

You will never work into the first chain from the hook. Depending on the stitch, you will work into the second, third, fourth, etc. chain from the hook. The instructions will always state how many chains to skip before starting the first stitch.

When working a stitch, insert hook from the front of the chain, through the center of the “V” and under the corresponding bump on the back of the same stitch (*Fig. 18*).

Excluding the first stitch, you will work into every stitch in the chain unless the pattern states differently, but not into the starting slip knot (*Fig. 18a*). Be sure that you do not skip that last chain at the end.

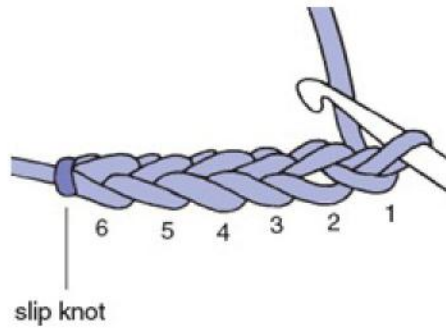

## LESSON 4: Single Crochet (abbreviated sc)

Most crochet is made with variations on just four different stitches: single crochet, double crochet, half double crochet and treble crochet. The stitches differ mainly in height, which is varied by the number of times the yarn is wrapped around the hook. The shortest and most basic of these stitches is the single crochet stitch.

### WORKING ROW 1

To practice, begin with the chain of six stitches made in Lesson 3 and work the first row of single crochet as follows:

**Step 1:** Skip first chain stitch from hook. Insert hook in the second chain stitch through the center of the “V” and under the back bump; with middle finger of left hand, bring yarn over the hook from back to front, and hook the yarn (*Fig. 19*).

Draw yarn through the chain stitch and well up onto the working area of the hook. You now have two loops on the hook (*Fig. 20*).

**Step 2:** Again bring yarn over the hook from back to front, hook it and draw it through both loops on the hook (*Fig. 21*).

One loop will remain on hook, and you have made one single crochet (*Fig. 22*).

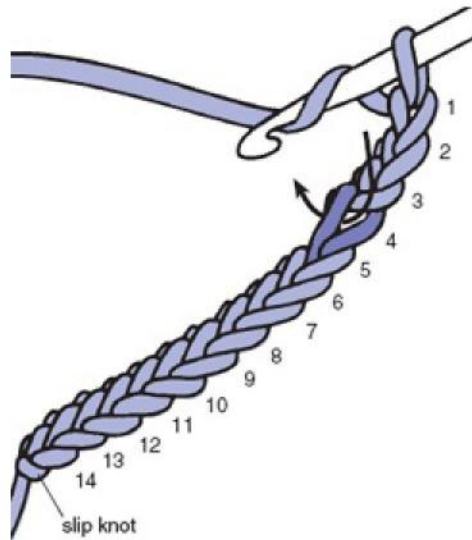

**Step 3:** Insert hook in next chain stitch as before, hook the yarn and draw it through the chain stitch; hook the yarn again and draw it through both loops. You have made another single crochet.

Rep Step 3 in each remaining chain stitch, taking care to work in the last chain stitch, but not in the slip knot. You have completed one row of single crochet, and should have five stitches in the row. *Fig. 23* shows how to count the stitches.

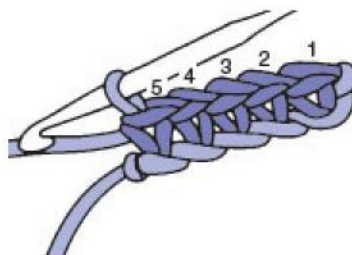

**Hint:** As you work, be careful not to twist the chain; keep all the “V” s facing you.

## WORKING ROW 2

To work the second row of single crochet, you need to turn the work in the direction of the arrow (*counterclockwise*), as shown in [Fig. 24](#), so you can work back across the first row.

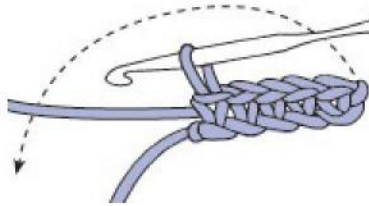

Do not remove the hook from the loop as you do this ([Fig. 24a](#)).

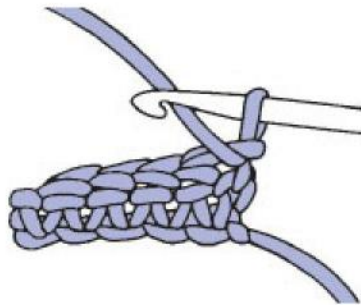

Now you need to bring the yarn up to the correct height to work the first stitch. So, to raise the yarn, chain one (*this is called a turning chain*).

This row, and all the following rows of single crochet, will be worked into a previous row of single crochet, not into the beginning chain as you did before. Remember that when you worked into the starting chain, you inserted the hook through the center of the “V” and under the bump. This is only done when working into a starting chain.

To work into a previous row of crochet, insert the hook under both loops of the previous stitch, as shown in [Fig. 25](#), instead of through the center of the “V”.

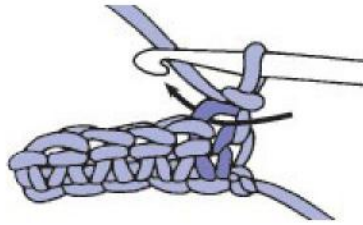

The first single crochet of the row is worked in the last stitch of the previous row (Fig. 25), not into the turning chain. Work a single crochet into each single crochet to the end, taking care to work in each stitch, especially the last stitch, which is easy to miss (Fig. 26).

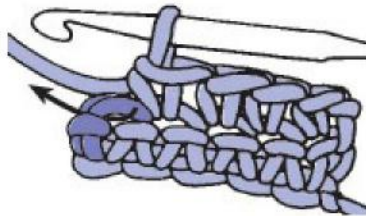

Stop now and count your stitches; you should still have five single crochet on the row (Fig. 27).

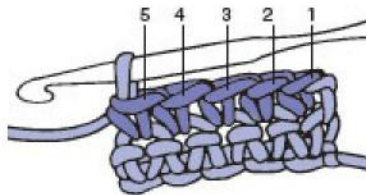

**Hint:** When you want to pause to count stitches, check your work, have a snack or chat on the phone, you can remove your hook from the work—but do this at the end of a row, not in the middle. To remove the hook, pull straight up on the hook to make a long loop (Fig. 28). Then withdraw the hook and put it on a table or other safe place (sofas and chairs have a habit of eating crochet hooks). Put work in a safe place so loop is not pulled out. To begin work again, just insert the hook in the big loop (don't twist the loop), and pull on the yarn from the skein to tighten the loop.

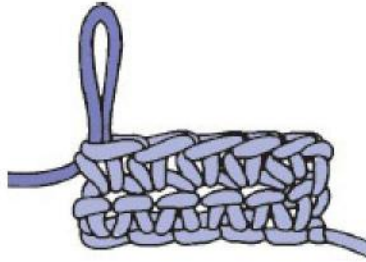

To end row 2, after the last single crochet, turn the work counterclockwise.

Here is the way instructions for row two might be written in a pattern:

**Note:** To save space, a number of abbreviations are used. For a list of abbreviations used in patterns, see [page 127](#).

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

### WORKING ROW 3

Row 3 is worked exactly as you worked row 2. Here are the instructions as they would be given in a pattern:

**Row 3:** Rep row 2.

Now wasn't that easy? For practice, work three more rows, which means you will repeat row 2 three times more.

**Hint:** Try to keep your stitches as smooth and even as possible. Remember to work loosely rather than tightly and to make each stitch well up on the working area of the hook. Be sure to turn at the end of each row and to check carefully to be sure you've worked into the last stitch of each row.

Count the stitches at the end of each row; do you still have five? Good work.

**Hint:** What if you don't have five stitches at the end of a row? Perhaps you worked two stitches in one stitch, or skipped a stitch. Find your mistake, then just pull out your stitches back to the mistake; pulling out in crochet is simple. Just take out the hook and gently pull on the yarn. The stitches will come out easily; when you reach the place where you want to start again, insert the hook in the last loop (taking care not to twist it) and begin.

### FASTENING OFF



It's time to move on to another stitch, so let's fasten off your single crochet practice piece, which you can keep for future reference. After the last stitch of the last row, leaving a 6-inch end, cut the yarn. As you did when you took your hook out for a break, draw the hook straight up, but this time draw the yarn cut end completely through the stitch. [Photo A](#) shows an actual sample of six rows of single crochet to which you can compare your practice rows. It also shows how to count the stitches and rows.



Now you can put the piece away, and it won't pull out (*you might want to tag this piece as a sample of single crochet*).

## LESSON 5: Double Crochet (abbreviated dc)

Double crochet is a taller stitch than single crochet. To practice, first chain 14 stitches loosely. Then work the first row of double crochet as follows:

### WORKING ROW 1

**Step 1:** Bring yarn once over the hook from back to front (*as though you were going to make another chain stitch*); skip the first three chains from the hook, then insert hook in the fourth chain (*Fig. 29*).

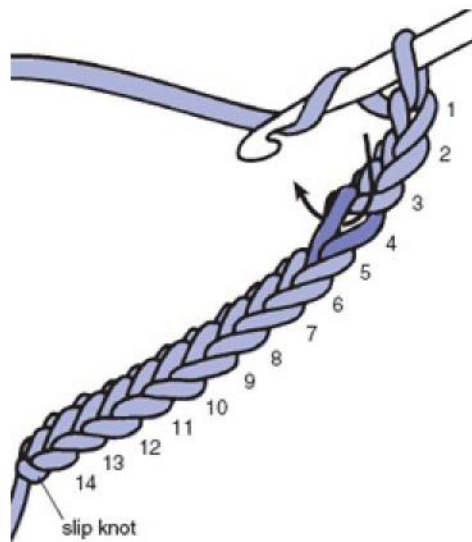

Remember not to count the loop on the hook as a chain. Be sure to go through the center of the “V” of the chain and under the bump at the back, and do not twist the chain.

**Step 2:** Hook yarn and draw it through the chain stitch and up onto the working area of the hook: you now have three loops on hook (*Fig. 30*).

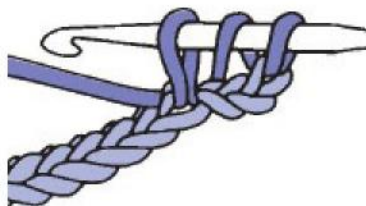

**Step 3:** Hook yarn and draw through first 2 loops on the hook (*Fig. 31*).

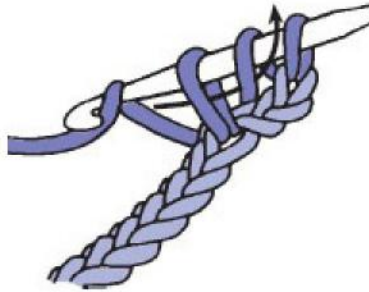

You now have 2 loops on the hook (*Fig. 32*).

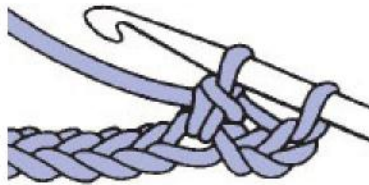

**Step 4:** Hook yarn and draw through both loops on the hook (*Fig. 33*).

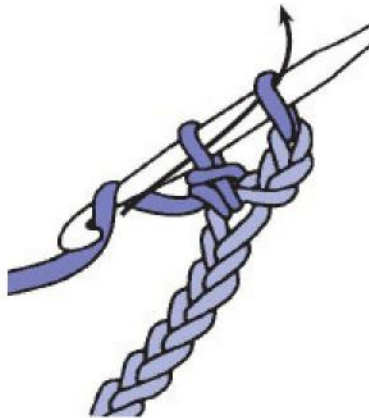

You have now completed one double crochet and one loop remains on the hook (*Fig. 34*).

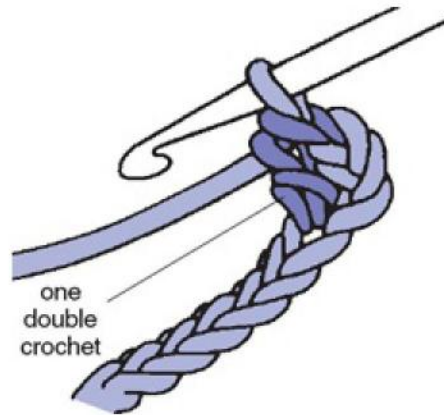

Repeat Steps 1 through 4 in each chain stitch across (*except in Step 1, work in next chain, don't skip three chains*).

When you've worked a double crochet in the last chain, pull out your hook and look at your work. Then count your double crochet stitches: There should be 12 of them, counting the first three chain stitches you skipped at the beginning of the row as a double crochet (*Fig. 35*).

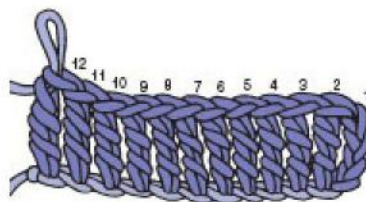

**Hint:** In working double crochet on a beginning chain row, the three chains skipped before making the first double crochet are usually counted as a double crochet stitch.

Turn the work counterclockwise before beginning row 2.

## WORKING ROW 2

To work row 2, you need to bring the thread up to the correct height for the next row. To raise the yarn, chain three (*this is called the turning chain*).

The three chains in the turning chain just made count as the first double crochet of the new row, so skip the first double crochet and work a double crochet in the second stitch. Be sure to insert hook under top two loops of stitch: *Figs.*

36a and 36b indicate the correct and incorrect placement of this stitch.

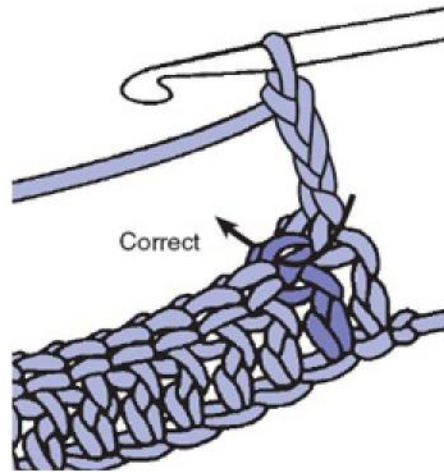

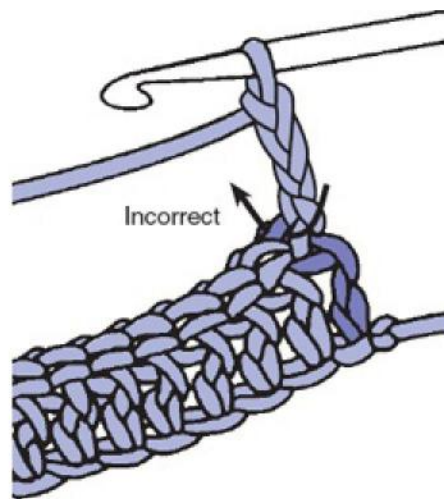

Work a double crochet in each remaining stitch across the previous row; at the end of each row, be sure to work the last double crochet in the top of the turning chain from the previous row. Be sure to insert hook in the center of the “V” (*and back bump*) of the top chain of the turning chain (*Fig. 37*). Stop and count your double crochets; there should be 12 stitches. Now, turn.

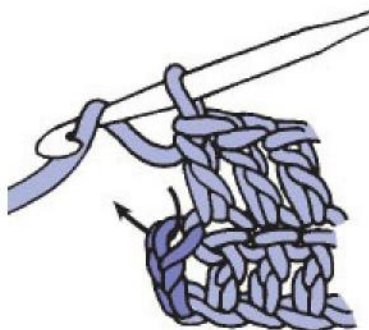

Here is the way the instructions might be written in a pattern:

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. (12 dc)

### **WORKING ROW 3**

Row 3 is worked exactly as you worked row 2.

In a pattern, instructions would read:

**Row 3:** Rep row 2.

For practice, work three more rows, repeating row 2. At the end of the last row, fasten off the yarn as you did for the single crochet practice piece. [Photo B](#) shows a sample of six rows of double crochet and how to count the stitches and rows.

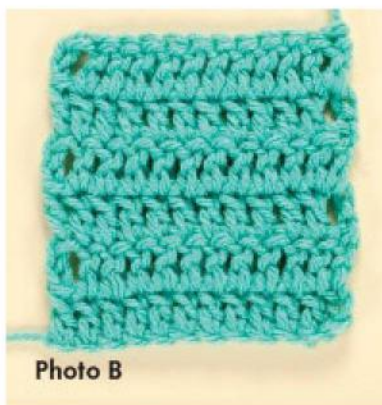

### **BREAK TIME!**

Now you have learned the two most-often-used stitches in crochet. Since you've worked so hard, it's time to take a break. Walk around, relax your hands, have a snack or just take a few minutes to release the stress that sometimes

develops when learning something new.

## LESSON 6: Half Double Crochet (abbreviated hdc)

Just as its name implies, this stitch eliminates one step of double crochet and works up about half as tall.

To practice, chain 13 stitches loosely.

### WORKING ROW 1

**Step 1:** Bring yarn once over hook from back to front, skip the first two chains, then insert hook in the third chain from the hook (*Fig. 38*).

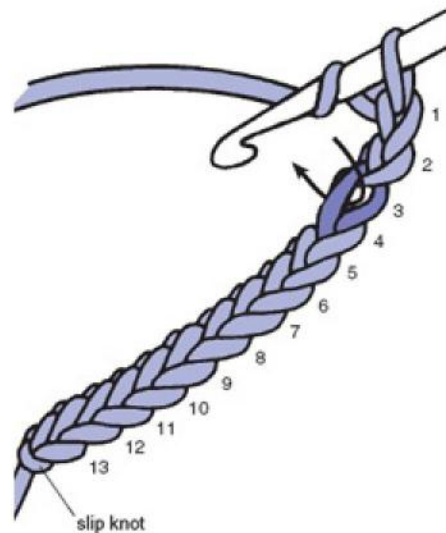

Remember not to count the loop on the hook as a chain.

**Step 2:** Hook yarn and draw it through the chain stitch and up onto the working area of the hook. You now have three loops on the hook (*Fig. 39*).

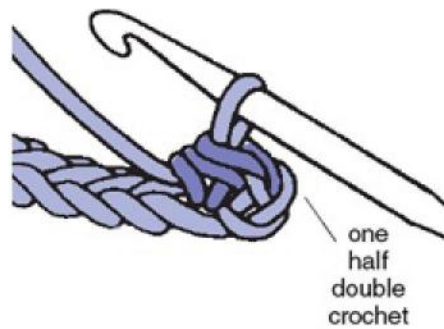


**Step 3:** Hook yarn and draw it through all three loops on the hook in one motion (*Fig. 40*).

You have completed one half double crochet and one loop remains on the hook (*Fig. 41*).

In next chain stitch, work a half double crochet as follows:

**Step 1:** Bring yarn over hook from back to front, insert hook in next chain.

**Step 2:** Hook yarn and draw it through the chain stitch and up onto the working area of the hook. You now have three loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Hook yarn and draw it through all three loops on the hook in one motion.

Repeat the previous three steps in each remaining chain stitch across. Stop and count your stitches: You should have 12 half double crochets, counting the first two chains you skipped at the beginning of the row as a half double crochet (*Fig. 42*).

Turn your work.

### WORKING ROW 2

Like double crochet, the turning chain counts as a stitch in half double crochet (*unless your pattern specifies otherwise*). Chain two, skip the first half double crochet of the previous row and work a half double in the second stitch (*Fig. 43*) and in each remaining stitch across the previous row. At the end of the row, chain two and turn.

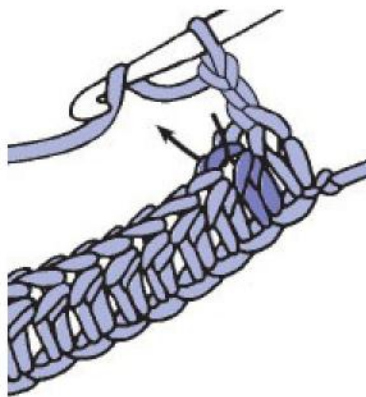

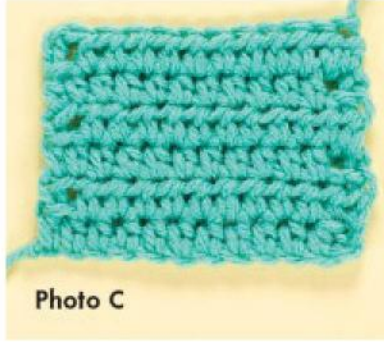
Here is the way the instructions might be written in a pattern:

**Row 2:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn. (12 hdc)

### WORKING ROW 3

Row 3 is worked exactly as you worked row 2.

For practice, work three more rows, repeating row 2. Be sure to count your stitches carefully at the end of each row. When the practice rows are completed, fasten off. [Photo C](#) shows a sample of six rows of half double crochet and how to count the stitches and the rows.

## LESSON 7: Treble Crochet (abbreviated tr)

Treble crochet is a tall stitch that works up quickly and is fun to do. To practice, first chain 15 stitches loosely. Then work the first row as follows:

### WORKING ROW 1

**Step 1:** Bring yarn twice over the hook (*from back to front*), skip the first four chains, then insert hook into the fifth chain from the hook (*Fig. 44*).

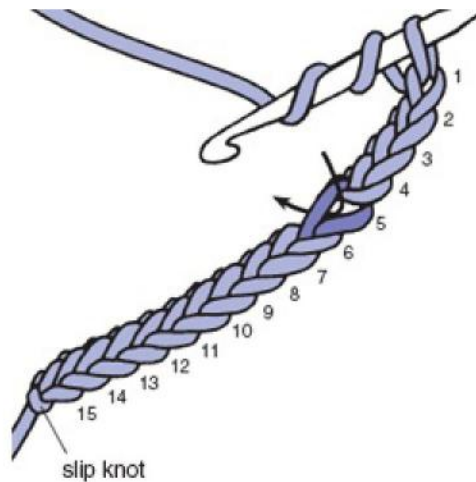

**Step 2:** Hook yarn and draw it through the chain stitch and up into the working area of the hook; you now have four loops on the hook (*Fig 45*).

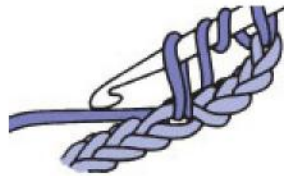

**Step 3:** Hook yarn and draw it through the first two loops on the hook (*Fig. 46*).

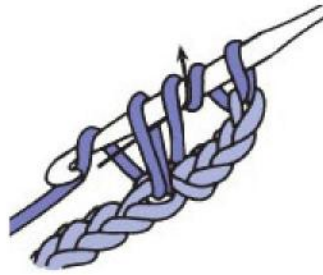

You now have three loops on the hook (*Fig 46a*).

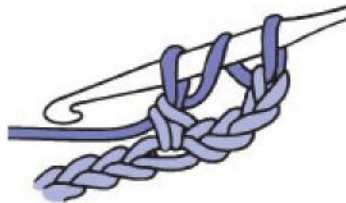

**Step 4:** Hook yarn again and draw it through the next two loops on the hook (*Fig. 47*).

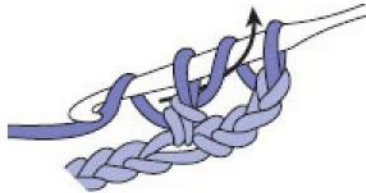

Two loops remain on the hook (*Fig. 47a*).

**Step 5:** Hook yarn and draw it through both remaining loops on the hook (*Fig. 48*).

You have now completed one treble crochet and one loop remains on the hook (*Fig. 49*).

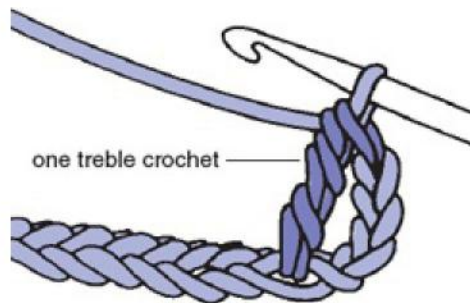

In next chain stitch work a treble crochet as follows:

**Step 1:** Bring yarn twice over the hook (*from back to front*); insert hook in the next chain (*Fig. 50*).

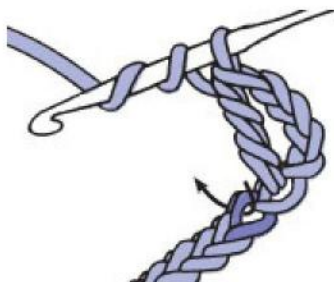

**Step 2:** Hook yarn and draw it through the chain stitch and up onto the working area of the hook; you now have four loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Hook yarn and draw it through the first two loops on the hook.

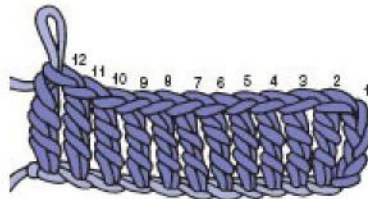
You now have three loops on the hook.

**Step 4:** Hook yarn again and draw it through the next two loops on the hook.

Two loops remain on the hook.

**Step 5:** Hook yarn and draw it through both remaining loops on the hook.

Repeat the previous five steps in each remaining chain stitch across. When you've worked a treble crochet in the last chain, count your stitches: There should be 12 of them, counting the first four chains you skipped at the beginning of the row as a treble crochet (*Fig. 51*); turn work.

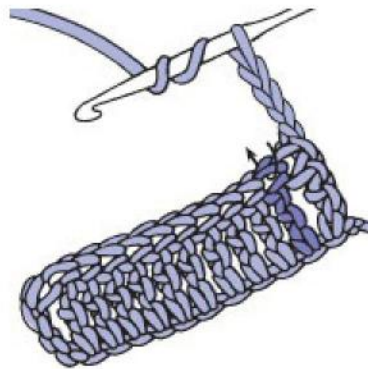

**Hint:** In working the first row of treble crochet, the four chains skipped before making the first treble crochet are always counted as a treble crochet stitch.

## WORKING ROW 2

Chain four to bring your yarn up to the correct height, and to count as the first stitch of the row. Skip the first stitch and work a treble crochet in the second stitch (*Fig. 52*).

Work a treble crochet in each remaining stitch across previous row; be sure to work last treble crochet in the top of the turning chain from the previous row. Count stitches: Be sure you still have 12 stitches; turn work.

*Hint: Remember to work last treble crochet of each row in turning chain of*

*previous row. Missing this stitch in the turning chain is a common error.*

Here is the way the instructions might be written in a pattern:

**Row 2:** Ch 4, tr in each tr across, turn. (12 tr)

### **WORKING ROW 3**

Work row 3 exactly as you worked row 2.

For practice, work three more rows, repeating row 2. At the end of the last row, fasten off the yarn. [Photo D](#) shows a sample of six rows of treble crochet and how to count the stitches and rows.





## LESSON 8: Slip Stitch (abbreviated sl st)

This is the shortest of all crochet stitches and is really more a technique than a stitch. Slip stitches are usually used to move yarn across a group of stitches without adding height, or they may be used to join work.

### MOVING YARN ACROSS STITCHES

Chain 10.

### WORKING ROW 1

Double crochet in the fourth chain from hook (*see page 111*) and in each chain across. Turn work. On the next row, you are going to slip stitch across the first four stitches before beginning to work double crochet again.

### WORKING ROW 2

Instead of making three chains for the turning chain as you would usually do for a second row of double crochet, this time just chain one. The turning chain-one does not count as a stitch; therefore, insert hook under both loops of first stitch, hook yarn and draw it through both loops of stitch and loop on the hook (*Fig. 53*); one slip stitch made.

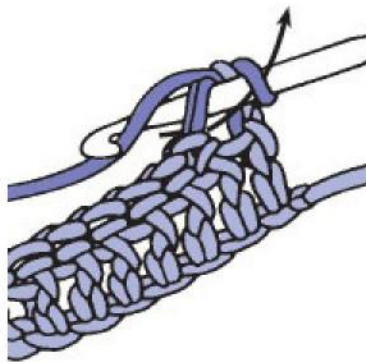
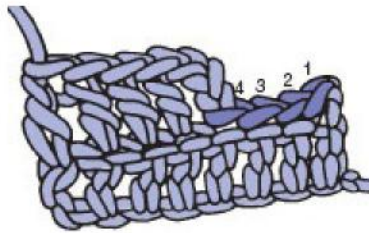

Work a slip stitch in the same manner in each of the next three stitches. Now we're going to finish the row in double crochet; chain three to get yarn at the right height (*the chain-three counts as a double crochet*), then work a double crochet in each of the remaining stitches. Look at your work and see how we

moved the yarn across with slip stitches, adding very little height (*Fig. 54*).

Fasten off and save the sample.

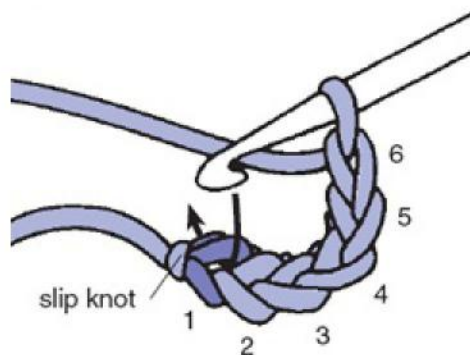
Here is the way the instructions might be written in a pattern.

**Row 2:** Sl st in each of next 4 dc, ch 3, dc in each rem dc, fasten off. (5 dc)

**Hint:** When slip stitching across stitches, always work very loosely.

### **JOINING STITCHES JOINING A CHAIN INTO A CIRCLE**

Chain six, then insert hook through the first chain you made (*next to the slip knot* —*Fig. 55*).



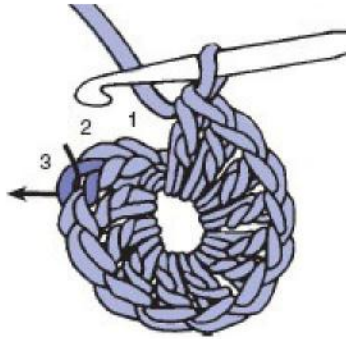

Hook yarn and draw it through the chain and through the loop on hook; you have now joined the six chains into a circle or a ring. This is the way many motifs, such as granny squares, are started. Cut yarn and keep this practice piece as a sample.

### **JOINING THE END OF A ROUND TO THE BEGINNING OF THE SAME ROUND**

Chain six; join with a slip stitch in first chain you made to form a ring. Chain

three; work 11 double crochet in the ring; insert hook in third chain of beginning chain three (*Fig. 56*); hook yarn and draw it through the chain and through the loop on the hook; you have now joined the round. Cut yarn and keep this piece as a sample.

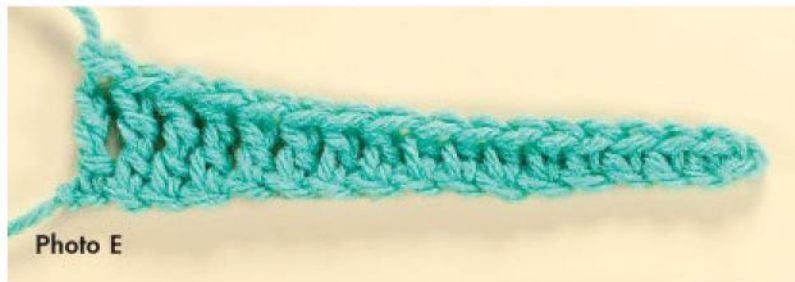
**Rnd 1:** Ch 3, 11 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

## LESSON 9: Stitch Sampler

Now you've learned the basic stitches of crochet! Wasn't it fun? The hard part is over!

To help you understand the difference in the way single crochet, half double crochet, double crochet and treble crochet stitches are worked, and the difference in their heights, let's make one more sample.

Chain 17 loosely. Taking care not to work too tightly, single crochet in the second chain from hook and in each of the next three chains; work a half double crochet in each of the next four chains; work a double crochet in each of the next four chains; work a treble crochet in each of the next four chains. Fasten off. Your work should look like [Photo E](#).



## LESSON 10: Bead Crochet

Now that you have mastered the basic crochet stitches, it is time to learn a technique which will give your work some sparkle.

Bead crochet is a simple technique in which you add beads to your work as you crochet the stitches.

In a pattern, you will be given the size beads necessary for the project.

Before beginning the project, slide the beads on the yarn. Follow the pattern until you are instructed to add a bead. To add a bead, simply slide a bead up to the loop on the hook (*Fig. 57*).

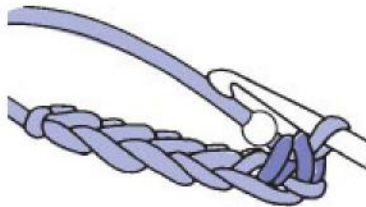

Now work the next stitch. Depending on which side of the work you want the bead to be, you will work the next stitch either behind the bead, to have the bead on the side of your work facing you, or in front of the bead, to have the bead on the side away from you.

## LESSON 11: Working With Colors

Working with colors often involves reading charts, changing colors and learning how to carry or pick up colors.

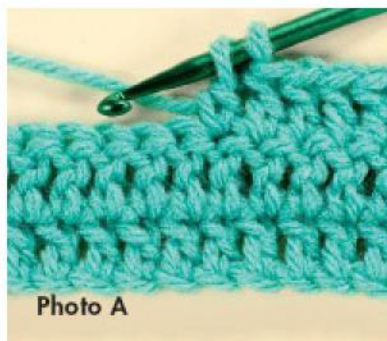
### WORKING FROM CHARTS

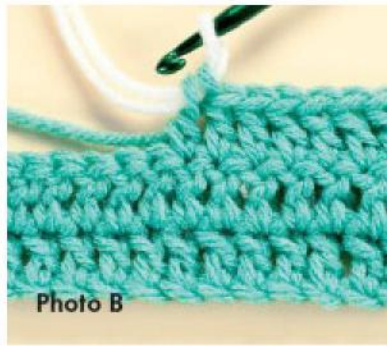
Charts are easy to work from once you understand how to follow them. When working from a chart, remember that for each odd-numbered row, you will work the chart from right to left and for each even-numbered row, you will work the chart from left to right.

Odd-numbered rows are worked on the right side of the piece and even-numbered rows are worked on the wrong side. To help follow across the row, you will find it helpful to place a ruler or sheet of paper directly below the row being worked.

### CHANGING COLORS

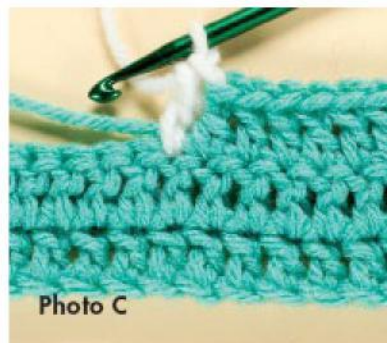
To change from working color to a new color, work the last stitch to be done in the working color until two loops remain on the hook (*Photo A*). Draw new color through the two loops on hook. Drop working color (*Photo B*) and continue to work in the new color. This method can be used when change of color is at the end of a row or within the row.





## **CARRYING OR PICKING UP COLORS**

In some patterns, you may need to carry a color on the wrong side of the work for several stitches or pickup a color used on the previous row. To carry a color means to carry the strand on the wrong side of the work. To prevent having loops of unworked yarn, it is helpful to work over the strand of the carried color. To do this, consider the strand a part of the stitch being worked into and simply insert the hook in the stitch and draw the new color through (*Photo C*). When changing from working color to a color that has been carried or used on the previous row, always bring this color under the working color. This is very important, as it prevents holes in your work.



## LESSON 12: Working With Thread

To work with thread, you will need a steel hook and some crochet thread.

### THREAD

Crochet thread comes in many sizes, ranging from very fine crochet cotton (sizes 80 and 100), used for lace-making and tatting, to sizes 30, 20 and 10, used for doilies and bedspreads. The larger the number, the thinner the thread. The most commonly used thread is size 10, and it is often called bedspread-weight. It is readily available in white, ecru and cream, as well as a wide variety of colors. As with yarn labels, always read thread labels carefully. The label will tell you how much thread is in the skein or ball in ounces, grams, meters or yards, the type of thread, usually cotton, and washability. Also, there is usually a dye-lot number. This number assures you that the color of each ball with this number is the same. Thread with the same color name may vary from dye lot to dye lot, creating variations in color when a project is completed. Therefore, when purchasing thread for a project, it is important to match the dye-lot number on the balls.

To weave in thread ends, a size 18 steel tapestry needle works well.

### HOOKS

Steel hooks are sized numerically from 14 (*smallest*) to 0, and are about 5 inches long, which is shorter than aluminum or plastic hooks. Their shape is different from other crochet hooks. There is the throat, then the shank, and after the shank, the steel begins to widen again before it reaches the fingerhold (*Fig. 58*).

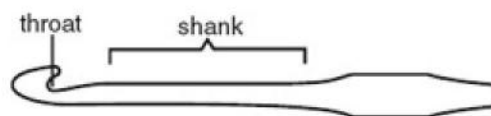

When crocheting, it is important that the stitches do not slide beyond the shank



as this will cause a loose tension and alter the gauge. If you find you are having difficulty at first, place a piece of tape around the hook to keep the stitches from sliding past the correct area. With practice, you will work in the right place automatically.

## LESSON 13: Special Helps

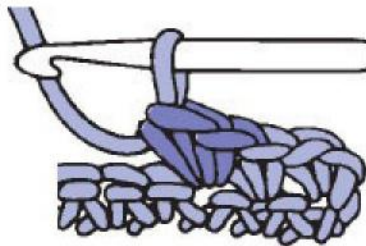
### INCREASING & DECREASING

Shaping is done by increasing, adding stitches to make the crocheted piece wider, or decreasing, subtracting stitches to make the piece narrower.

**Note:** Make a practice sample by chaining 15 stitches loosely and working four rows of single crochet with 14 stitches in each row. Do not fasten off at end of last row. Use this sample swatch to practice the following method of increasing stitches.

**Increasing:** To increase one stitch in single, half double, double or treble crochet, simply work two stitches in one stitch. For example, if you are working in single crochet and you need to increase one stitch, you would work one single crochet in the next stitch; then you would work another single crochet in the same stitch.

**For practice:** On sample swatch, turn work and chain one. Single crochet in each of first two stitches; increase in next stitch by working two single crochets in stitch (*Fig. 59*).



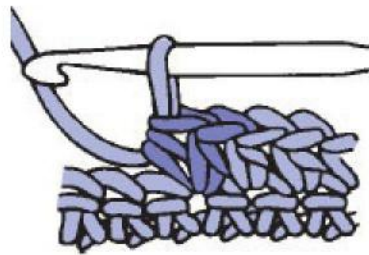
single crochet increase

Repeat increase in each stitch across row to last two stitches; single crochet in each of next two stitches. Count your stitches: You should have 24 stitches. If you don't have 24 stitches, examine your swatch to see if you have increased in each specified stitch.

Rework the row if necessary.

Increases in half double, double and treble crochet are shown in Figs. 59a, 59b and 59c.



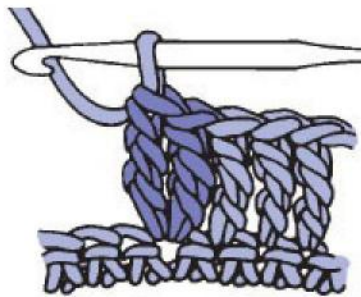
half double crochet increase

**Note:** Make another practice sample by chaining 15 loosely and working four rows of single crochet. Do not fasten off at end of last row. Use this sample swatch to practice the following methods of decreasing stitches.

**Decreasing:** This is how to work a decrease in the four main stitches. Each decrease gives one fewer stitch than you had before.

**Single crochet decrease (sc dec):** Insert hook and draw up a loop in each of the

next two stitches (three loops now on hook), hook yarn and draw through all three loops on the hook (*Fig. 60*).

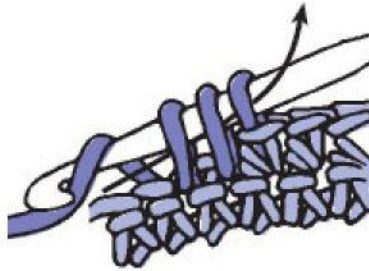

Single crochet decrease made (*Fig. 61*).

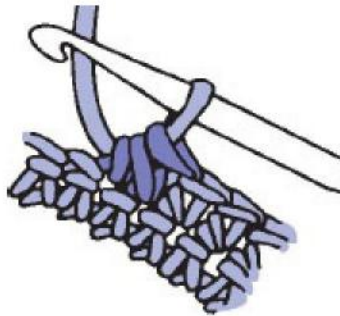

**Double crochet decrease (dc dec):** Work a double crochet in the specified stitch until two loops remain on the hook (*Fig. 62*).

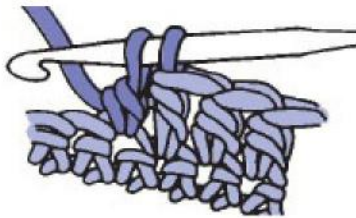

Keeping these two loops on hook, work another double crochet in the next stitch until three loops remain on hook; hook yarn and draw through all three loops on the hook (*Fig. 63*).

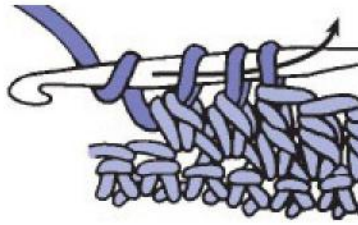

**Half double crochet decrease (hdc dec):** Yo, insert hook in specified stitch and draw up a loop, three loops remain on the hook (*Fig. 65*).

Keeping these three loops on hook, yo and draw up a loop in the next stitch (*five loops now on hook*), hook yarn and draw through all five loops on the hook (*Fig. 66*).

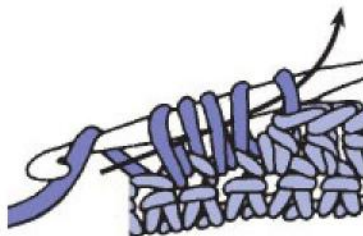

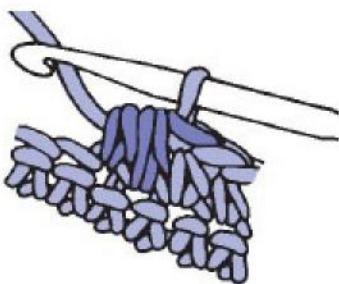

**Treble crochet decrease (tr dec):** Work a treble crochet in the specified stitch until two loops remain on the hook (*Fig. 68*).

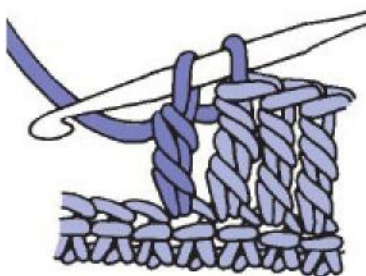

Keeping these two loops on hook, work another triple crochet in the next stitch until 3 loops remain on the hook; hook yarn and draw through all loops on the hook (*Fig. 69*).

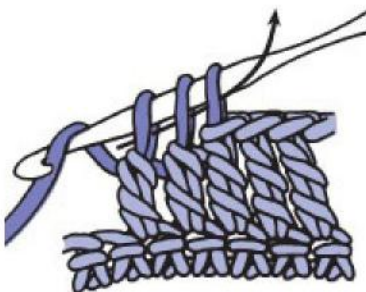

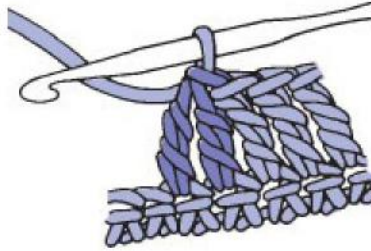

## JOINING NEW THREAD

Never tie or leave knots! In crochet, yarn ends can be easily worked in and hidden because of the density of the stitches. Always leave at least 6-inch ends when fastening off yarn just used and when joining new yarn. If a flaw or a knot appears in the yarn while you are working from a skein, cut out the imperfection and rejoin the yarn.

Whenever possible, join new yarn at the end of a row. To do this, work the last stitch with the old yarn until two loops remain on the hook, then complete the stitch with the new yarn (*Fig. 71*).

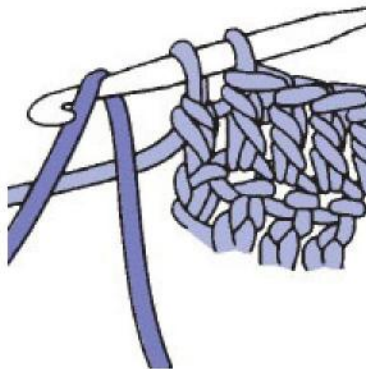

To join new yarn in the middle of a row, when about 12 inches of the old yarn remains, work several more stitches with the old yarn, working the stitches over the end of new yarn (*Fig. 72 shown in double crochet*). Then change yarns in stitch as previously explained.

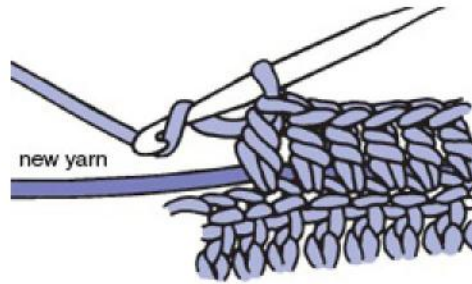

Continuing with the new yarn, work the following stitches over the old yarn end.

## FINISHING

A carefully crocheted project can be disappointing if the finishing has been done incorrectly. Correct finishing techniques are not difficult, but do require time, attention and knowledge of basic techniques.

**Weaving in ends:** The first procedure of finishing is to securely weave in all yarn ends. Thread a size 16 steel tapestry needle with yarn, then weave running stitches either horizontally or vertically on the wrong side of work. First weave about 1 inch in one direction and then  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in the reverse direction. Be sure yarn doesn't show on right side of work. Cut off excess yarn. Never weave in more than one yarn end at a time.

**Sewing seams:** Edges in crochet are usually butted together for seaming instead of layered, to avoid bulk. Do not sew too tightly—seams should be elastic and have the same stretch as the crocheted pieces.

Carefully matching stitches and rows as much as possible, sew the seams with the same yarn you used when crocheting.

**Invisible seam:** This seam provides a smooth, neat appearance because the edges are woven together invisibly from the right side. Join vertical edges, such as side or sleeve seams, through the matching edge stitches, bringing the yarn up through the posts of the stitches (*Fig. 73*).



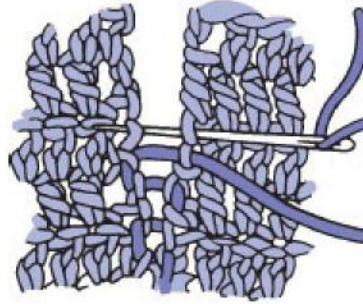

If a firmer seam is desired, weave the edges together through both the tops and the posts of the matching edge stitches.

Backstitch seam: This method gives a strong, firm edge and is used when the seam will have a lot of stress or pull on it. Hold the pieces with right sides together and then sew through both thicknesses as shown (Fig. 74).

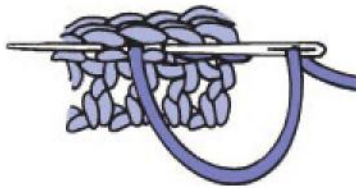

Overcast seam: Strips and pieces of afghans are frequently joined in this manner. Hold the pieces with right sides together and overcast edges, carefully matching stitches on the two pieces (Fig. 75).

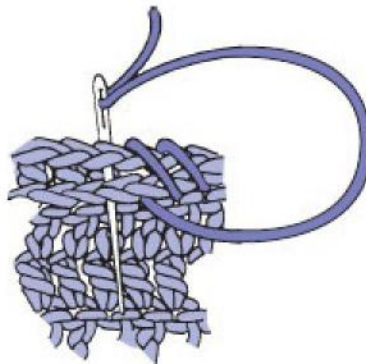

Edges can also be joined in this manner, using only the back loops or the front loops of each stitch (see page 173).

Crocheted seam: Holding pieces with right sides together, join yarn with a slip stitch at right-side edge. Loosely slip stitch pieces together, being sure not to pull stitches too tightly (*Fig. 76*). You may wish to use a hook one size larger than the one used in the project.

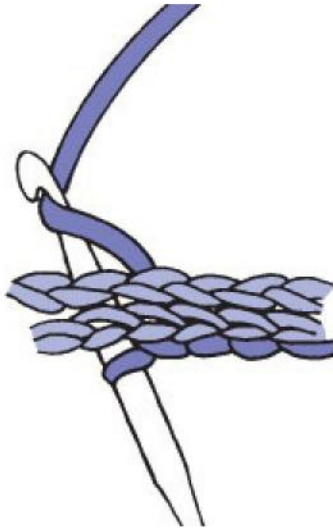

## EDGING

**Single crochet edging:** A row of single crochet worked around a completed project gives a finished look. The instructions will say to “work a row of single crochet, taking care to keep work flat.” This means you need to adjust your stitches as you work. To work the edging, insert hook from front to back through the edge stitch and work a single crochet. Continue evenly along the edge. You may need to skip a row or a stitch here or there to keep the edging from rippling, or add a stitch to keep the work from pulling.

When working around a corner, it is usually necessary to work at least three stitches in the corner center stitch to keep the corner flat and square (*Fig. 77*).

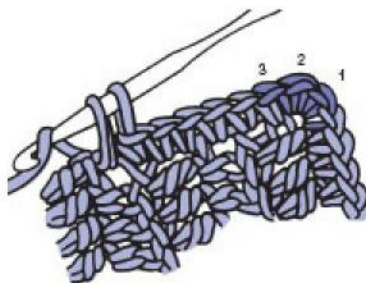

**Reverse single crochet edging:** A single crochet edging is sometimes worked from left to right for a more dominant edge. To work reverse single crochet, insert hook in stitch to the right (*Fig. 78*), hook yarn and draw through stitch, hook yarn and draw through both loops on the hook (*Fig. 79*).

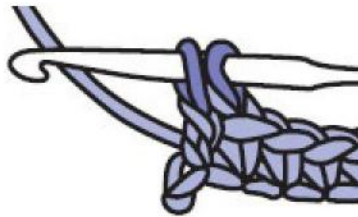

## LESSON 14: Reading Patterns

### ABBREVIATIONS

Crochet patterns are written in a special language full of abbreviations, asterisks, parentheses, brackets and other symbols and terms. These short forms are used so instructions will not take up too much space. They may seem confusing at first, but once understood, they are really easy to follow.

## SYMBOLS

An asterisk is used to mark the beginning of a portion of instructions which will be worked more than once; thus, “rep from \* twice” means after working the instructions once, repeat the instructions following the asterisk twice more (*3 times in all*).

[ ] Brackets are used to enclose instructions which should be repeated the number of times specified immediately following the brackets: “[2 sc in next dc, sc in next dc] twice.” Brackets are also used to indicate additional or clarifying information for multiple sizes: “child’s size 2 [4, 6]”; “Row 29 [31, 33].”

( ) Parentheses are used to set off and clarify a group of stitches that are to be worked all into the same space or stitch, such as: “(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in corner sp.”

{ } Braces are used to indicate a set of repeat instructions within a bracketed or parenthetical set of repeat instructions: “[{ch 5, sc in next shell sp} twice, ch 5, sk next dc]”; “({dc, ch 1} 5 times, dc) in next ch sp.”

## TERMS

**Front loop (front lp)** is the loop toward you at the top of the stitch (*Fig. 80*).

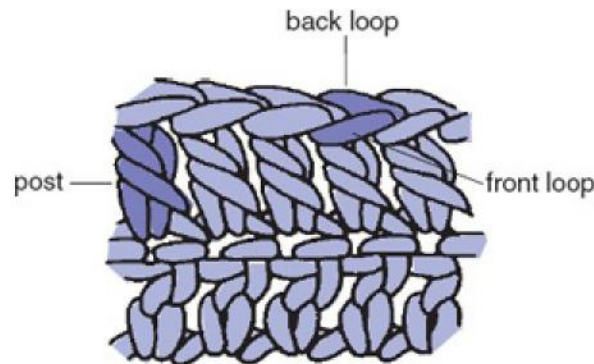

**Back loop (back lp)** is the loop away from you at the top of the stitch (*Fig. 80*).

**Post** is the vertical part of the stitch (*Fig. 80*).

**Work even** means to continue to work in the pattern as established, without increasing or decreasing.

**Wrong side (WS):** The side of the work that will not show when project is in use.

**Right side (RS):** The side that will show.

**Right-hand side:** The side nearest your right hand as you are working.

**Left-hand side:** The side nearest your left hand as you are working.

**Right front:** The piece of a garment that will be worn on the right-hand side of the body.

**Left front:** The piece of a garment that will be worn on the left-hand side of the body.

## LESSON 15: Gauge

We've left this until last, but it really is the single most important thing in crochet.

If you don't work to gauge, your crocheted projects may not be the correct size, and you may not have enough yarn to finish the project.

Gauge means the number of stitches per inch and rows per inch that result from a specified yarn worked with a specified-size hook. Since everyone crochets differently—some loosely, some tightly, some in-between—the measurements of individual work can vary greatly when using the same-size hook and yarn. It is **your responsibility** to make sure you achieve the gauge specified in the pattern.

Hook sizes given in instructions are merely guides and should never be used without making a 4-inch-square sample swatch to check gauge. Make the sample gauge swatch using the size hook, yarn and stitch specified in the pattern. If you have more stitches per inch than specified, try again using a larger-size hook. If you have fewer stitches per inch than specified, try again using a smaller-size hook. Do not hesitate to change to a larger-or smaller-size hook, if necessary, to achieve gauge. If you have the correct number of stitches per inch, but cannot achieve the row gauge, adjust the height of your stitches. This means that after inserting the hook to begin a new stitch, draw up a little more yarn if your stitches are not tall enough—this makes the first loop slightly higher; draw up less yarn if your stitches are too tall. Practice will help you achieve the correct height.

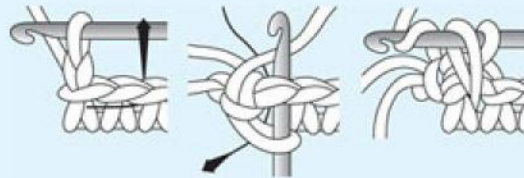

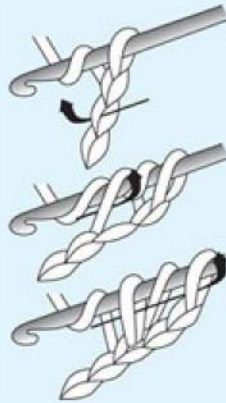

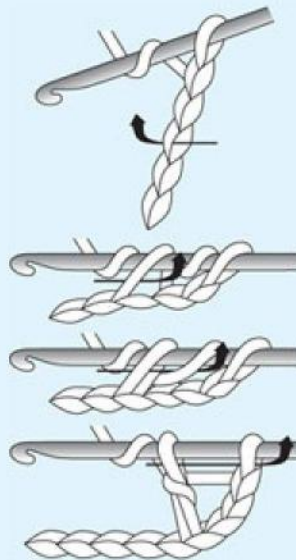

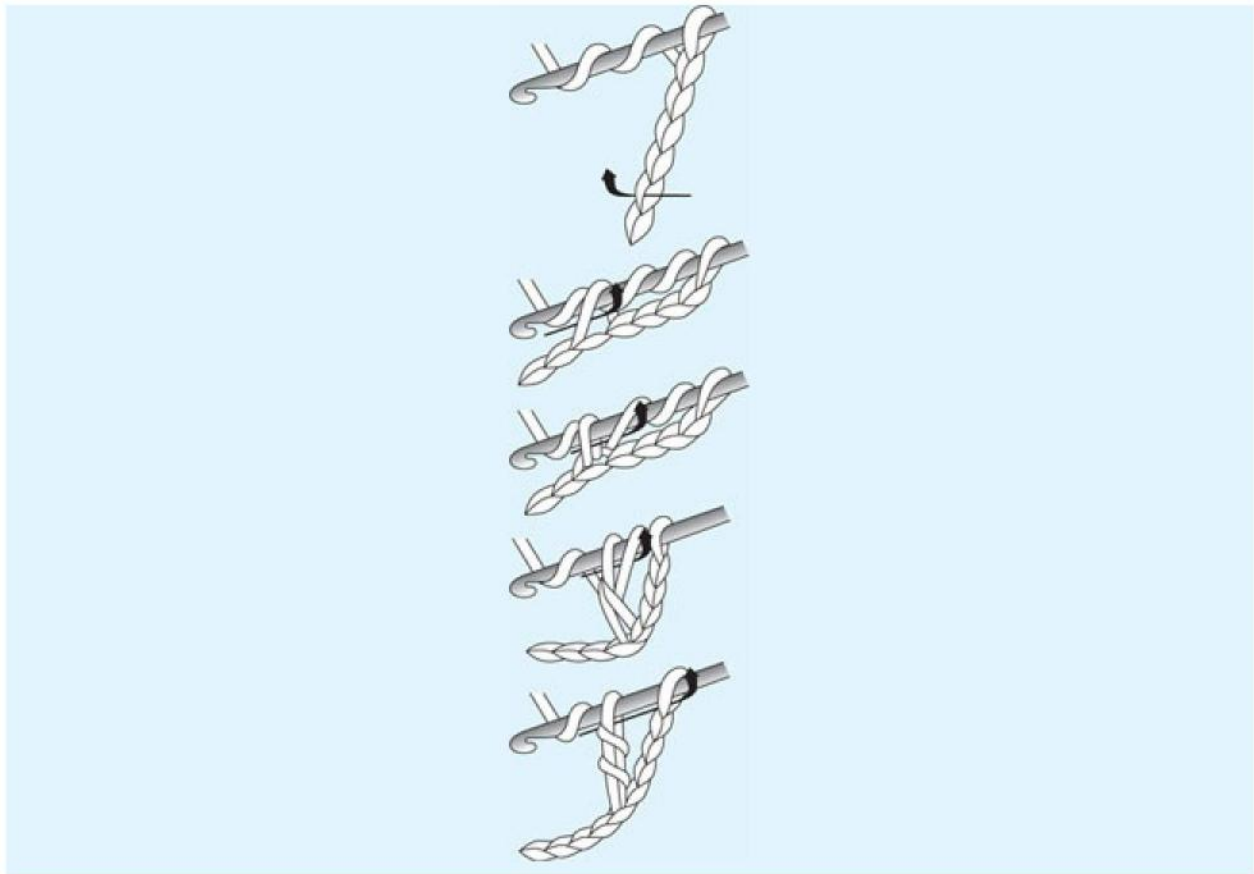

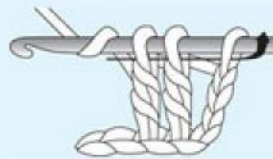

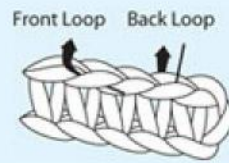

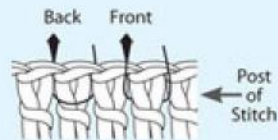
