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


About this Book

Crochet Flowers (pages 18-97)



Each flower features a chart, a photograph of the finished flower, and a written pattern. You'll find step-by-step instructions and photographs that will guide you through the trickiest parts of the pattern, give you extra information, and introduce you to new stitches and techniques. Once you're confident in your crochet skills, check out "Choose a Flower" on pages 6-7 to see all the flowers side by side and pick the ones that appeal to you.



Projects (pages 98-109)

You can use your finished flowers as embellishments, but you can also make them into unique projects, and here you will learn how. Five varied projects for garments and home accessories are presented here with full patterns, charts, and construction diagrams.

Additional diagrams show you how to piece your projects together



Tools and Materials

The right tools are an important part of any project, and crochet is no exception. Luckily, all you need to get started is a crochet hook, some yarn, and just a few additional tools.

Yarns

Yarns differ in composition and weight (how thick the yarn is). Cotton yarn and threads are usually the most smooth, and will give the most definition to crochet flowers. For each flower in this book I have listed a recommended yarn weight and hook size, but you can experiment with different yarns and combine them with different hook sizes to get various results, as shown here.



Yarn: Cotton thread # 30 Hook size: IO (I.3 mm)

Yarn: Cotton thread # IO Hook size: 5 (I.9 mm)





Yarn: Acrylic/wool/mohair light fingering/3 ply Hook size: I (2.5 mm)





Yarn: Acrylic bulky/ chunky weight Hook size: H (5 mm)

Other Useful Tools

Scissors

Any sharp scissors will do the job. Consider getting a small pair of very sharp scissors with a cover or holder to use exclusively for your crochet projects.

Stitch markers

For crochet you need a stitch marker that has a fastening on it so it will stay in place. You don't need to go out and purchase stitch markers, though; you can always use a scrap piece of yarn in a contrasting color to mark your rounds (see page 59).

Yarn needle

For weaving in ends you need a special yarn needle with a big eye and blunt point.

Crochet Hooks

Crochet hooks can be made of various materials: steel, aluminum, plastic, and bamboo. Picking a hook material is often a matter of preference and availability, so try out different options.

Crochet hook sizes are chosen according to the yarn you are using. Look at the yarn label to pick out the correct hook. You can also bring your yarn when you are shopping for hooks, and make sure that the yarn strand fits nicely in. Remember that using different sizes of hooks with the same yarn size will yield different sizes of flower.

Crochet hooks are sized in different ways in different countries, and can vary from manufacturer to manufacturer. The chart on the left will help you to make sure you have the right size crochet hook for any project.


Get Started Grocheting

This section will walk you through the essentials of crocheting. Learn how to begin a project, basic stitches, useful techniques, and how to read a crochet chart. Before you know it you'll be ready to start your first crochet flower project.

Getting Started

Start all crochet work with either a slip knot or a magic ring.

Slip knot



I. Make a yarn loop, as pictured.




2. Insert your crochet hook, as shown.


3. Gently pull on the short and long ends of yarn while holding the hook to create a slip knot.




Magic ring



I. Start by making a loop in your yarn, as pictured. Insert the hook into the loop from the top, following the direction of the arrow.




2. Hook the working yarn and pull through the loop, as pictured.



3. Make one chain stitch (or more, if directed by the pattern).



4. Crochet the desired number of stitches into the center of the loop.






Essential Stitches

If you're new to crocheting, take some time to practice these essential stitches as they will form the basis of the flower patterns.

O Chain (ch)



I. Start by making a slip knot (see page I2).



2. Wrap the working yarn around the hook as pictured. Pull on the end of hook while holding the short yarn, and pull the yarn through the loop that is on the hook.




3. You have now made one chain stitch (the slip knot does not count as a stitch).



Slip stitch (sl st)



I. Locate the stitch in which you need to make a slip stitch. For example, if you need to join a round after making chain stitches, you will make a slip stitch into the first chain, shown here with an arrow.





2. Insert the hook into the stitch. Wrap the working yarn around the hook (this is also called a yarn over, or yo). Draw the yarn through both loops on the hook.

+ Single crochet (sc)



I. Insert the hook into the loop where the stitch will be made. Yarn over. Pull the yarn through the first loop on the hook only (indicated with an arrow).



2. Now you have two loops on the hook. Yarn over again. Pull the yarn through both loops on the hook (follow the arrow).



3. You have one loop left on the hook. One single crochet stitch has been made.



4. Repeat Steps I–3 until you have the desired number of single crochet stitches.

Half double crochet (hdc)



I. Yarn over. Find the loop where an hdc will be made and insert the hook into the loop from front to back.



2. Pull a loop through this chain. You will have three loops on the hook. Yarn over again. Pull yarn through all three loops on the hook.



3. One half double crochet (hdc) stitch made.



4. Repeat Steps I–3 until you have the desired number of half double crochet stitches.

Double crochet (dc)



I. Start making a double crochet exactly the same way as you did with the hdc. Yarn over, insert hook into the loop. Pull a loop through the chain. Yarn over, and pull the yarn through the first two loops on the hook only (follow the arrow).



2. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the remaining two loops on the hook.



3. You have completed one double crochet (dc) stitch.



4. Repeat Steps I–3 until you have the desired number of double crochet stitches.

Treble crochet (tr)



I. A treble crochet is made in a similar way to a double crochet. You start with making a yarn over twice, as pictured. Then insert hook into the loop where you want to make the stitch. Pull a loop through the chain.



2. Yarn over, and pull the yarn through the first two loops on the hook. Do this three times.



3. In the end only one loop will remain on the hook. You have completed one treble (tr) stitch.



4. Repeat Steps I–3 until you have the desired number of treble crochet stitches.

Crochet Crash Course

You can crochet in rows or in rounds, depending on the pattern.

Working in rows

To crochet in rows, you generally start by making a long chain, and then make stitches across that chain.



If you are right-handed, you will crochet from right to left.



If you are left-handed, you will crochet from left to right.



As you finish a row, and instructions tell you to turn work, turn your crocheted piece and start working on top of the stitches you have made in the first row. You can turn clockwise or counterclockwise but you will get a neater edge if you are consistent.

After you finish crocheting in the row, it is a good idea to count your stitches to make sure you are on the right track. Looking at the stitches from the top, you will notice V-shaped stitches—each V-shape is one stitch. The row pictured here has 7 stitches. In the next round, insert the hook into the V-shape as shown to make a new stitch. Insert the hook so that it catches both sides of the V-shape, unless the pattern states otherwise.

Working in rounds



I. Working in rounds is similar to working in rows. You will be crocheting counterclockwise if you are right-handed, or clockwise, if you are left-handed.



2. As you finish the round, often you will need to "join round with slip stitch." To do that, make a slip stitch into the very first stitch of the round, as shown by the arrow. It is a good idea to use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch in each round so that you will always know where your first stitch is and when you have reached the end of the round.




3. After you finish the round, you can count the stitches as you did with the row. A joining slip stitch doesn't usually count as an extra stitch, so you will have one extra V-shape.

Increasing stitches



I. To increase the number of stitches you have in a row or a round, you will need to make a few new stitches into one stitch of a previous row.




2. Start by making the first stitch, and then insert the hook back into the same stitch that you just crocheted into.



3. Make the second stitch into that same stitch also.

Decreasing stitches



I. To decrease the number of stitches in a row or a round, in this book you will notice this abbreviation: sc2tog (which means 2 single crochet stitches together). Start by locating the next two stitches.




2. Insert the hook into the next stitch, yarn over, pull the yarn through the first loop on the hook. Insert the hook into the next stitch, yarn over, pull the yarn through the first loop on the hook. You will have three loops on the hook now.



3. Yarn over and pull the yarn through all three loops on the hook. One sc2tog stitch is complete.


Fastening off and weaving in ends



I. To fasten off, cut off the long yarn end 3–4 inches (7.5–10 cm) away from the hook.



2. Insert the yarn end into the last loop and pull on the yarn to tighten the last loop.





Rnd I: Into magic ring: Ch 2, I2 dc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st.




Rnd 2: [Ch 6, skip next dc, sl st in next dc] six times.




Working in rows

Ch 12.

Row I: Starting with 2nd ch from hook, sl st in 2 ch, sc in next 2 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, dc in next 2 ch, tr in next 3 ch.

Grochet Flowers

This section of the book presents a selection of 35 flower designs for you to crochet, complete with written patterns, charts, and helpful step-by-step instructions to help you along the way. Start at the beginning to gradually build your crochet skills or turn to pages 6–7 for a colorful visual guide to help you choose your favorite flower.



Chrysanthemum

Skill level:

This is a perfect first project as you learn to crochet! This beautiful layered flower can be made using only two basic stitches: chain and slip stitch. Try adding even more layers to make a three-dimensional flower.



Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 3 colors:

Color A: 1 yd (1 m)

Color B: 3 yds (2.75 m)

Color C: 7 yds (6.5 m)

Diam. of finished flower: 3 in (7.5 cm)



Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors

Chart key:

- Magic ring
- Ch Chain
- Sl st Slip stitch

Pattern

Small petals:

With Color A, make a magic ring (see Steps I-3).

[Ch 5, sl st into magic ring] six times.

Medium petals: With Color B, make a magic ring.

[Ch IO, sl st into magic ring] I2 times (see Steps 4-6).

Large petals:

With Color C, make a magic ring. [Ch 15, sl st into magic ring] 18 times. Fasten off (see Step 7).

Connect all flowers (see Step 8).

Small petals




Medium petals




Continue around. 12 petals in total.

Large petals



Tip: After you have practiced following this pattern, you can adjust the number of chain stitches uou make for each petal, and the number of petals, to create any size flower you like!




2 Anemone

Skill level:



This flower is quick and easy to make, using only chains, single crochets, and slip stitches. It is simple enough to be the very first crochet project for a beginner, and is an excellent project for practicing your stitches.

Continue around all 6 petals.



Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 4 yds (3.75 m)

Color B: 4 yds (3.75 m)

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors

Chart key:

- O Ch Chain
- Sl st Slip stitch
- + Sc Single crochet

Pattern

With Color A, ch 2 (see Step I).

Rnd I: 6 sc in 2nd ch. Join rnd with sl st (see Steps I-2). (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st (see Steps 3-4). (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Ch 6, skip next sc, sl st in next sc] six times (see Steps 5-6).


Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B to any ch-6 loop.

Rnd 4: [10 sc in first ch-6 loop of prev rnd] six times (see Steps 7-8).


Join rnd with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off Color B. Weave in ends.











Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in the first sc, 2 sc into each of the next 5 sc. Join the round with a sl st. (I2 sc in the round).



When both rounds are completed, your flower will look like this.




Rnd 3: Ch 6, skip the next sc, then sl st into the next sc of Round 2 (refer to the arrow for the placement of the first sl st) to connect the petal.



Repeat Step 5 five more times to create six petals in total.



Attach Color B to the first loop of any of the ch-6 loops in Round 3. Ch I. Rnd 4: Work IO sc evenly along the first ch-6 loop.






3 Grocus

Skill level:

Using just two simple techniques, you can make a three-dimensional crocus_flower. Use contrasting colors for the two parts of the flower and vary them to make different flowers for all your decoration needs.



Materials:


Sport weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 10 yds (9 m)

Color B: 1 yd (1 m)

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors



Pattern

Petals:

With Color A, ch 8, sl st in first ch to make ring (see Step I).

Rnd I: [Ch I2, sl st in ring] six times (see Step 2-3).

Rnd 2: *[Sl st, ch 2, 20 dc, ch 2, sl st] in ch-I2 loop].

Rep from * five more times (see Steps 4–6).

Fasten off Color A. Weave in ends.

Stamens:

With Color B, ch IO, starting from 2nd ch from hook sl st in next 8 ch (see Step 7). [Ch 9, starting from 2nd ch from hook sl st in next 8 ch] twice (see Step 8).

Finish with sl st in first ch of stamen. Leave long end to sew flower together. Sew stamens to center of petals. Weave in short end.



Chart key:

- Ch Chain
- Sl st Slip stitch
- To Double crochet

Diam. of finished flower: 4 in (IO cm)
















4 Rnd 2: Work a sl st into the beginning of any ch-I2 loop petal. Ch 2, 20 dc into the loop.



6 Into the next ch-I2 loop, sl st, ch 2, 20 dc, ch 2, sl st. Repeat this for each petal. Fasten off Color A and weave in the ends.



With Color B, ch IO, then, starting from the 2nd ch from the hook sl st into the next 8 ch.

[Ch 9, starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, sl st into the next 8 ch] twice more. Finish by making a sl st into the first ch of the stamens (indicated by the arrow). Leave a long end and use this to sew the stamens to the petals. Weave in the short end.



4 Hawkesbury River Daisy

Skill level:

Using only single crochet and chain stitches, you will be able to create this beautiful daisy flower with loopy petals. Practicing this flower is a great way to learn a simple technique for attaching a second color to your work.

Materials:

Sport weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 3 yds (2.75 m)

Color B: 18 yds (16.5 m)

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors

Pattern

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page I2).

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc) (see Step I).

Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st. (I2 sc) (see Step 2).

Rnds 3-5: Ch I, sc in each, sc. Join rnd with sl st. (see Step 3).

Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B (see Steps 4-5).


Rnd 6: [Ch I5, sl st in next sc of Rnd 5] I2 times (see Steps 6–7).

Rnd 7: [22 sc in ch-I5 loop, sl st in sl st between petals] I2 times (see Step 8).
Fasten off Color B. Weave in ends.

Chart key:

- Magic ring
- Ch Chain
- + Sc Single crochet
- Sl st Slip stitch

Diam. of finished flower: 4½ in (II.5 cm)





With Color A: Rnd I: Into a magic ring (see page I2), ch I, then work 6 sc. Pull on the short end to close the middle. Join the round with a sl st into the first ch.



Rnd 2: Ch I, work 2 sc in each sc. Join the round with a sl st. You may find it useful to use a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of each round. Just attach a marker to the first stitch of the round, and move it outward to the beginning of the next round each time you reach it.



Rnds 3–5: Ch I, sc into each sc. Join the round with a sl st. At the end of Round 5, fasten off Color A.



Attach Color B, following these steps: Insert your hook into the loops of a stitch on the previous round. Make a slip knot on the hook with the Color B yarn.



Yarn over. Pull the loop of Color B yarn through the other two loops on the hook. Color B is now attached and you can continue as normal.



6 Rnd 6: Ch I5, sl st into the next sc of Round 5 to connect the petal.



Repeat Step 6 II more times to create I2 petals.



Rnd 7: [Work 22 sc evenly into the ch-I5 loop, sl st into the sl st between the petals—marked here with an arrow] I2 times. Fasten off Color B and weave in ends to finish.

5 Marigold

This flower pattern combines a few of the techniques that you have already learned to create a beautiful layered marigold flower. You will also learn how to create a lovely contrasting border.

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle

Scissors

Materials:

Sport weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 4 yds (3.75 m)

Color B: 10 yds (9 m)



Pattern

Small petals:

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page I2). [Ch 8, sl st in magic ring] IO times (see Step I). Fasten off Color A.

Large petals:

With Color B, make a magic ring.

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st (see Step 2). (I2 sc)

Rnd 3: [Ch 6, sl st in next sc] I2 times (see Step 3).

Rnd 4: [II hdc in ch-6 loop] I2 times. Join rnd with sl st in first hdc (see Step 4).

Fasten off Color B (see Step 5).

Attach Color A (see Step 6).

Sl st in each hdc (see Step 7).

Fasten off Color A. Sew flower together and weave in ends (see Step 8).




Chart key:

- (O, Magic ring
- Ch Chain
- Sl st Slip stitch
- + Sc Single crochet
- T Hdc Half double crochet

Large petals

Repeat for all 12 petals





Small petals: With Color A, [ch 8, sl st into a magic ring] IO times. Tighten the magic ring by pulling on the short end, and fasten off Color A, leaving a long end for sewing the flower together.



Large petals: With Color B, make a magic ring (see page I2). Follow the pattern for Rounds I and 2. At the end of Round 2, your flower will look like this.



Rnd 3: [Ch 6, sl st into the next sc] I2 times to create I2 petals.



Rnd 4: [II hdc into the ch-6 loop] I2 times. Join the round with a sl st into the first hdc of the round.



Fasten off Color B. Your large petals will now look like this.



Using the long thread you left in Step I, connect both parts of the flower together with a yarn needle, as shown. Weave in all ends.



Attach Color A to the last round of stitches (see page 27, Steps 4–5).



Make a sl st in every hdc all the way around the previous round. Fasten off Color A.

6 Forget-Me-Not

Skill level:


These delicate crochet flowers are perfect to decorate girls' dresses and accessories. You may find making a stem intimidating at first, but just follow the step-by-step instructions and you will see the shape unfold perfectly.



Diam. of finished flower: I in (2.5 cm)

Materials:

Sport weight yarn in 3 colors:



Color B: 4 yds (3.75 m)

Color C: ¼ yd (23 cm) per flower

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle

Scissors



Length of finished stem: 3 in (7.5 cm)

Pattern

Stem:

With Color B, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch (see Step I).

Ch I3, starting from 2nd ch from hook sl st in next I2 ch (see Steps 2-3).

Ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch (see Step 4).

4 hdc in stem between two leaves. Sl st in first ch of pattern (see Step 5). Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Flower (see Step 7):

With Color A, ch 5, sl st in first ch to make ring.


Rnd I: [Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring] five times.

Fasten off, weave in ends.

Pollen:

With Color C, ch 4. Join rnd with sl st. Fasten off, leaving long ends (see Step 8).

Sew pollen, flower, and stem together.




Flower

Chart key:


- Ch Chain
- + Sc Single crochet
- T Hdc Half double crochet
- Sl st Slip stitch
- Dc Double crochet







To make the stem: To form the first leaf, ch 6 and then, starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, sc into the next ch, hdc into the next 2 ch, sc into the next ch, sl st into the next ch.





Ch 6 and then, starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, sc, hdc into the next 2 ch, sc into the next ch, sl st into the next ch.



Work 4 hdc into the stem between the two leaves (see the black arrow above). Sl st into the first ch of the pattern (indicated by the red arrow).



The stem and leaves are now complete. Fasten off and weave in ends.

To make the flower: Ch 5 and join into a ring with a sl st. Rnd I: [Ch 2, dc into the ring, ch 2, sl st into the ring] five times. You will have created five petals. Fasten off and weave in ends.



To make the pollen: Ch 4 and join into a round with a sl st. Fasten off, leaving long ends of yarn. Using a yarn needle and the long ends you left, sew the pollen part to the flower and the stem. You could also make simple flower heads without the stems.

7 Hawaiian Plumeria

Skill level:

This is the perfect pattern to teach you how to create various shapes by crocheting around a long chain. In this case, the result is a beautiful Hawaiian flower which will inspire the feeling of an exotic vacation.

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors

Chart key:

- O Ch Chain
- + Sc Single crochet
- Hdc Half double crochet
- Dc Double crochet
- Sl st Slip stitch

Materials:

Sport weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 10 yds (9 m)

Color B: 8½ yds (7.75 m)

Pattern

With Color A:

Rnd I: Ch I2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next 2 ch, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, 3 sc in next ch (corner) (see Steps I-2).







Hdc into the next 2 ch, dc into the next 5 ch, hdc into the next 2 ch, 2 sc into the next ch. Fasten off Color A.





Attach Color B to the first sc of Round I (see page 27, Steps 4–5). Rnd 2: Ch I then sc into the same sc.

Sc into the next 3 sts, 2 sc into the next 3 dc, sc into the next 5 sts, make a 3 ch picot as follows: ch 3, sl st into the 3rd ch from the hook (as marked by the arrow).



Sc into the same sc as the last sc, sc in the next 4 sts, 2 sc into the next 3 dc, sc into the next 5 sts. Join to the first sc worked in Color A with a sl st. Fasten off Color B.



Make five petals by following the pattern at left. Weave in ends but leave a long yarn tail on one of the petals for joining the petals.



Gather the bases of the five petals together and sew them together using the long yarn tail and the yarn needle. Make sure that the picot corners of the petals are facing outward for the best look.

Clematis

Skill level:

This is a gorgeous little flower, and simple to make, so why not make a bouquet? You will learn a new stitch in this pattern: the treble crochet, and will use a different variation of the picot that you learned in the Hawaiian Plumeria pattern on pages 32-33.

Diam. of finished

Little Leaves, flower: 21/2 in (6.5 cm) page 97

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)



When you have a finished flower with six petals, fasten off Color B and weave in all ends. Make sure that the middle of the flower is pointing outward.



Here you'll learn another way to create a flower—by crocheting in rows. Using contrasting yarns, you will recreate the beautiful delicate edging of a begonia.

Row 2: Ch 2, IO dc in first ch loop, ch 2, sl st in same loop, [ch 2, 5 dc in next ch-2 loop, ch 2, sl st in same loop] in each of remaining ch-2 loops (see Steps 3-4).

Fasten off Color A, leaving a I2-in (30.5-cm) tail for sewing.

Attach Color B to beginning of Row 2 (see Step 5).

Row 3: Work into back loops only.

Ch 2, sc in next 3 dc, hdc in next 4 dc, sc in next 3 dc, ch 2, sl st in sl st between petals (see Step 6).

*Ch 2, sc in next dc, hdc in next 3 dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, sl st in sl st between petals (see Step 7).


Rep from * for each remaining petal. Last sl st will be in last sl st of Row 2.

Fold into flower shape with the large petal in the middle (see Step 8). Use long yarn end to sew flower together.



*Ch 2, sc into the next dc, hdc into the next dc, sc into the next dc, ch 2, sl st into the sl st between the petals. Repeat from * for each petal. The last sl st will be made into the last sl st of Row 2.



Fold into a flower shape as below, with the large petal in the center. Use the long yarn end you left in Step 5 to sew the flower together. Fasten off and weave in all the ends.



10 Black-Eyed Susan

Skill level:

These flowers are made using techniques you will already be familiar with, adding just a few small new tricks. You can use this pattern to make simple daisies too; just change the colors to yellow and white.

Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 2 yds (1.8 m)

Color B: 10 yds (9 m)

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle



With Color A, make a magic ring (see page 12). Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st. (12 sc)

Rnds 3-4: Ch I, sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st.

Rnd 5: Ch I, [sc in next sc, sc2tog, sc in next sc] three times (see Steps I-4 to learn sc2tog). Join rnd with sl st. (9 sts)


Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B.


Rnd 6: *Ch I2, starting from 5th ch from hook, sc in next 8 ch, sl st in next sc. Rep from * eight more times (see Step 5).

Rnd 7: *Sc in 8 ch, [2 sc, 3 ch picot, 2 sc] in ch-4 loop, sc in next 8 sc, sl st in sl st.

Rep from * eight more times, crocheting around each petal. Fasten off Color B. Weave in ends (see Steps 6-8).

You will now have three loops on the hook.



Yarn over and pull the yarn through all three loops on the hook. The sc2tog is now complete. Continue following the pattern for Round 5.

Attach Color B. Rnd 6: *Ch I2, starting from the 5th ch from the hook, sc into the next 8 ch. Sl st into the next st. Repeat from * eight more times to create nine petals in total.



You will crochet Round 7 around the existing petals.

Rnd 7: *Ch 2, sl st into the next dc, sl st into the next tr, sl st into the next dc, ch 2, sc into the sl st. Repeat from * eight more times.





12 Mini Rose

Skill level:

This is another sweet and delicate flower to make. While crocheting this rose, you will learn some very simple new techniques for creating beautiful three-dimensional flowers.



Diam. of finished flowers: small—½ in (1.3 cm), large— ¾ in (2 cm)

Length of finished leaf: I in (2.5 cm)



Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 2 colors:

Color A: 2 yds (1.75 m) per flower

Color B: 2½ yds (2.25 m) per stem with 1 leaf

Tools

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm) Yarn needle Scissors

Small flower:

With Color A, ch 7, 5 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 5 dc in each ch. Ch 2, sl st in same ch as last dc. Fasten off (see Steps I-2).

Large flower:

With Color A, ch 9, 5 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 5 dc in each ch. Ch 2, sl st in same ch as last dc. Fasten off.

Leaf:

With Color B, ch 6. Join rnd with sl st in first ch. Ch I, [2 sc, 2 hdc, 2 dc, 2 ch picot, 2 dc, 2 hdc, 2 sc] in ch-6 loop. Join rnd with sl st.

Fasten off.

Stem with leaf:

With Color B, ch 6. Join rnd with sl st in first ch. Ch I [2 sc, 2 hdc, 2 dc, 2 ch picot, 2 dc, 2 hdc, 2 sc] in ch-6 loop, ch 20, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch, sl st in first sc of leaf. Fasten off.

Follow **Steps 3–8** to learn how to join extra leaves and flowers to a stem.



Small flower






To make a small flower: Ch 7, work 5 dc into the 3rd ch from the hook, as shown here. Yarn over and pull the yarn through. To make a large flower, follow the written pattern.

2 5 dc into each remaining ch. Ch 2, then sl st into the same st as the final dc.
Fasten off and leave a long yarn end. The rose will fold itself into a bud. Make a few stitches with the yarn and needle to secure the shape of the rose.



To attach multiple leaves to the stem: Follow the pattern for "Stem with leaf" but ch 7 for the stem part, rather than ch 20. Insert the hook into a second leaf to attach. Yarn over, then pull the yarn through both loops on the hook.





When you reach a place on the stem where you want to attach a rose, insert the hook into any loop at the wrong side of the rose. Yarn over, then pull the yarn through both loops on the hook to secure the rose.



7 Continue making a sl st into every ch of the stem. Finish by making a sl st into the first sc of the leaf.



Fasten off and weave in all ends. As you can see, the leaf and the rose will be securely attached to the stem.

13 Purple Rose

Skill level:

This gorgeous flower can be made by crocheting in rows, instead of rounds. It will only require a few connecting stitches with a needle, but you will love the volume created by this technique.

Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 1 color:

22 yds (20 m)

Tools:

Hook size: D-3 (3.25 mm)

Yarn needle Scissors





Ch 48.


Row I: 5 dc in 3rd ch from hook, [skip 2 ch, 5 dc in next ch] I5 times (see Steps I-2).

Row 2: Turn work, [ch 2, dc in next 5 dc, ch 2, sl st in same st as last dc] eight times (see Steps 3-5). [Ch 2, dc in next 3 dc, ch 2, sl st in same st as last dc, ch 2, dc in same st as last sl st, dc in next 2 dc, ch 2, sl st in same st as last dc] I6 times (see Step 6).

Fasten off, leaving a I2-in (30.5-cm) end for sewing.

Fold flower as shown in **Steps 7–8**. Using the long yarn end, sew the flower at the bottom to hold its shape.





14 Harlequin



To create this colorful and striking harlequin flower, you will use familiar techniques, and learn one fun new technique for adding layers to your crochet flowers.

Color C: 3 yds (2.75 m)

Rnd 3: *[3 hdc, 7 dc, 3 ch picot, 7 dc, 3 hdc] in ch-I5 loop, sc in 2nd sl st between petals (see

Rep from * five more times (6 petals in total). Fasten off Color A.

Small petals:

With Color B, make a magic ring (see page 12).

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st.

Rnd 2: [Ch 7, skip next sc, sl st in next sc] three

Rnd 3: *[2 sc, hdc, 7 dc, hdc, 2 sc] in ch-7 loop,

sc in sl st between petals (see Step 3).

Rep from * twice more.

Fasten off Color B leaving a I2-in (30.5-cm) end for sewing.

Attach Color C to any skipped sc in Rnd I (see Steps 4-5).

Rnd 4: [Ch 6, sl st in next skipped sc] three times (see Steps 6-7).

Rnd 5: *[2 sc, 6 hdc, 2 sc] in ch-6 loop, sc in

sl st between petals.

Rep from * twice more (see Step 8).

Fasten off Color C. Weave in ends. Use long yarn end in Color B to sew flower together.

Diam. of finished flower: 4½ in (II.5 cm)





Follow the pattern to make Round I. On Round 2, you will be making long loops with chain stitches and joining them back to the center of the flower to form petals. After you make a chain, skip one dc, then make a sl st into each of the next 2 dc, which are marked with sl st symbols on the above picture.



Rnd 3: Work [3 hdc, 7 dc, 3 ch picot, 7 dc, 3 hdc] evenly into the first ch-I5 loop. Sc into the 2nd sl st between the petals (as indicated by the arrow above). Follow the pattern to repeat for all six petals, then fasten off Color A.



Follow the pattern to make the small petals. Use the arrow above as a guide for placing the sl sts between petals. The small petals part will only have three petals per layer. When you fasten off Color B, remember to leave a I2-in (30.5-cm) end for sewing.



Attach Color C to any skipped sc in Round I of the small petals, as marked with an arrow.



Fold the petals out of the way as you go. This will make adding another layer of petals easier.



Create the second layer of small petals, following the pattern at left. Place the next sl st into the next skipped sc in Round I.



This is how this part of the flower will look once one round in Color C has been crocheted over the small petals. Notice how they fall between the Color B petals.


Rnd 5: Work *[2 sc, 6 hdc, 2 sc] into a ch-6 loop, sc into the sl st between the petals. Repeat from * for the two remaining petals. Fasten off Color C and weave in all ends. Sew the two parts of the flower together using the long yarn end of Color B you left in Step 3.



15 Purple Dahlia

Skill level:

This is a bright and colorful flower that uses only techniques you have used before in earlier patterns. This is the perfect pattern to practice making slip stitches without making them too tight.



Pattern

Small petals:

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page 12).

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st.

Rnd 2: *Ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch.

SI st in next sc of Rnd I.

Rep from * five more times (6 petals) (see Steps I-2). Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B to base of petal (see Step 3).

*SI st in each of 6 ch on one side of petal, 2 ch picot, sI st in back loop of 6 sts on other side of petal. SI st in sI st between petals.

Rep from * five more times—around each petal (see Steps 4–7).

Medium petals:

With Color C, make a magic ring.

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch I. 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st. (I2 sc)

Rnd 3: *Ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 3 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch.

SI st in next sc of Rnd 2.

Rep from * II more times (12 petals).

Fasten off Color C.

Attach Color B to base of petal (see Step 3).

*SI st in each of 8 ch on one side of petal, 2 ch picot, sI st in back loop of 8 sts on other side of petal. SI st in sI st between petals.

Rep from * II more times—around each petal.

Large petals:

With Color D, make a magic ring.

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch I, 2 sc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st. (I2 sc)

Rnd 3: Ch I, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] six times. Join rnd with sl st. (I8 sc)

Rnd 4: *Ch IO, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 3 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next 2 ch.

Sl st in next sc of Rnd 3.

Rep from * 17 more times (18 petals).

Fasten off Color D, leaving a long yarn end for sewing. Attach Color B to base of petal (see Step 3).

*Sl st in each of 9 ch on one side of petal, 2 ch picot, sl st in back loop of 9 sts on other side of petal. Sl st in sl st between petals.

Rep from * 17 more times—around each petal.

Join tiers of petals by sewing them together using long yarn end and yarn needle.



Diam. of finished flower: 4 in (IO cm)



Small petals:
Rnd I: Into a magic
ring (see page I2),
ch I, 6 sc. Pull on the short
end to close the middle.
Join the round with a sl st.
Rnd 2: *Ch 7.



Sc into the 2nd ch from the hook, hdc into the next ch, dc into the next 2 ch, hdc into the next ch, sc into the next ch. Then work a sl st into the next sc of Round I (marked by the arrow).



Repeat Steps I and 2 five more times to create six petals in total. Fasten off Color A and attach Color B to the base of any petal, as marked by the arrow. Use this picture as a guide for placing the stitches in Steps 4–6.



Sl st into each ch along one side of the petal. Do not tighten the yarn too much when you are making slip stitches. If you are finding that your slip stitches are too tight, try using a hook that is one size larger for this part of the pattern.



Work a 2 ch picot. To do this: ch 2, sl st into the second ch from the hook (marked by the arrow).



6 Sl st into the back loop of each of the 6 stitches along the other side of the petal. Sl st into the sl st between the petals.







Make medium and large petals in the same way.
Layer the petals with the largest at the bottom and sew the flower together.

16 Rain Lily

Skill level:

These are such delicate summer flowers, and so easy to make using soft shades of pink and a small amount of yellow yarn. Always use a stitch marker when you are working many rounds in single crochet stitches so you can easily find the beginning of each round.



Rnd 7: Ch I, *sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, ch 4, hdc in next sc, sc in next sc.

Rep from * four more times. (5 petals)

5 petals.

Join rnd with sl st (see Steps 2-4).

Rnd 8: Ch I, *sc in next 2 sts, [2 hdc, 2 dc, 3 ch picot, 2 dc, 2 hdc] in next ch-4 loop, sc in next

Rep from * four more times. Join rnd with sl st. Fasten off and weave in ends (see Step 5).

Stamens:

With Color B, ch 30.

Fasten off. Tighten knots on both ends of chain to prevent unraveling (see Step 6).

Thread yellow chain through middle of flower as pictured in Step 7. Tie knots at both ends of chain (see Step 8).



Follow the pattern to make Rounds I–6. At the end of Round 6, your piece will look like this.



Rnd 7: Ch I, sc into the next sc, hdc into the next sc, ch 4, hdc into the next sc, sc into the next sc (use the symbols above as a guide for placing the last two sts).



Work [sc into the next sc, hdc into the next sc, ch 4, hdc into the next sc, sc into the next sc] another four times.



Join the round with a sl st. You will see five petals start to emerge.



Rnd 8: Ch I, *sc into the next 2 sts, [2 hdc, 2 dc, 3 ch picot, 2 dc, 2 hdc] into the next ch-4 loop, sc into the next 2 sts. Repeat from * four more times. Join the round with a sl st. Fasten off and weave in ends.



6 To make the stamens: Ch 30 with Color B. Fasten off and tighten the knots at either end of this chain.



Thread the yellow chain through the middle of the pink flower. The back of the flower will look like this.



Rnd 5: *[Sl st, ch 3, 15 tr, ch 3, sl st] in ch-10 loop.

Rep from * five more times (6 petals) (see Steps **3–4** for a refresher on the treble crochet stitch).

Fasten off Color B.

Attach Color C to sl st between any two petals (see Step 7).

Rnd 6: *Ch 3, sl st in first tr, [ch 3, sl st in next tr] 14 times. Ch 3, sl st in base of same petal.

Rep from * for each remaining petal.

Fasten off.

Weave in all ends.





Sl st into the first tr, [ch 3, sl st into the next tr] I4 times. Ch 3, sl st into the base of the same petal. Repeat Steps 7–8 for each of the remaining five petals. Fasten off Color C and weave in all ends.



18 Cherry Blossom



Many beautiful crochet flowers are created by combining layers of different colors and petal shapes. This delicate cherry blossom is a wonderful example of that. As some of these petals overlap, you will also learn a new way of reading crochet charts.



Attach Color C to a 2nd sl st between petals (see Step 6).

Rnd 4: Work around next petal: *Sc in next 2 ch, [sc, hdc] in next hdc, [hdc, dc] in next dc, 3 ch picot, [dc, hdc] in next dc, [hdc, sc] in next hdc, sc in next 2 ch, sl st in 2nd sl st between petals (see Step 7).

Rep from * for each petal (see Step 8). Fasten off Color C. Weave in ends.





Following the pattern, crochet Round I using Color A.



In Round 2, ch 4, then sc between two petals. To make an sc between petals, insert the hook into the center of the flower, pull the yarn through, then finish as a regular sc stitch. Continue following the instructions for Round 2 of the pattern.



Make sure that you crochet the chain stitches behind the petals. This is the view from the wrong side.



Attach Color B to one of the ch-4 loops. You can fold each petal over to view the chain better when crocheting Round 3.





Fasten off Color B. Weave in ends.

Row I: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next 2 ch.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next sc, dc in next 8 sts, 2 dc in next 4 sts, dc in next 8 ch, hdc in next ch, ch 2, sl st in same ch as last hdc (see Steps I-2).

Fasten off Color A.

Large petal (make 3):

With Color A, ch I2.

Row I: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next 2 ch.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next sc, dc in next 8 sts, 2 dc in next 4 sts, dc in next 8 ch, hdc in next ch (see Steps 3-4).

Row 3: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next hdc, dc in next 9 dc, 3 hdc in next dc, 2 hdc in next dc, sc in next 2 dc, 2 hdc in next dc, dc in next 9 dc, hdc in next hdc, ch 2, sl st in same st as last hdc.

Fasten off Color A.

One of the petals should have a long yarn end for sewing (see Step 5).

Stem:

With Color B, make a magic ring (see page I2). Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st (see Step 6).

Work in spiral, sc in each sc. Make sure right side is on the outside. Crochet until desired length reached. Sl st in next 2 sts (see Steps 7–8).

Fasten off Color B leaving a long yarn end for sewing.

Leaf:

With Color B, ch 25.

Row I: Starting from 3rd ch from hook, hdc in next 3 ch, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sl st in next ch.

Row 2: Ch I, turn, sc in next 2 hdc, hdc in next 2 dc, dc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next 4 sts, dc in next 5 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next 2 ch (see Steps 9-II).

Row 3: Ch I, turn, sc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 7 sts, [hdc, dc] in next hdc, [dc, 2 tr] in next hdc, 3 ch picot, [2 tr, dc] in next hdc, [dc, hdc] in next hdc, hdc in next 7 sts, sc in next 4 sts (see Step I2).

Continue working in ch without turning work: dc in first ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next 9 ch, 3 sc in next ch (corner), sc in next 9 ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch. Join with sl st in first sc of Row 3 (see Steps I3-I4). Fasten off Color B.

Rnd 2: Working in front loops only: *Ch 2, dc in same sc, [dc, ch 2, sl st] in next sc.

Rep from * twice more. Sl st in back loop of Rnd I.

Rnd 3: Working in back loops of Rnd I only: Ch 2, 2 dc in each sc. Join rnd with sl st in front loop of first dc (see Steps 2–3). (I2 dc)

Rnd 4: Working in front loops of Rnd 3 only: Ch I, *[sc, hdc] in next dc, [dc, tr, dc] in next dc, [hdc, sc, sl st] in next dc.

Rep from * three more times (4 petals).

Attach Color B to back loop of first dc of Rnd 3. Do not fasten off Color A.

Rnd 5: With Color B, working in back loops of Rnd 3 only: Ch 2, 2 dc in each dc. Join with sl st in front loop of first dc (see Step 4). (24 dc)

Rnd 6: With Color A, ch 3, sl st in first front loop of Rnd 5. Working in front loops only: Ch I, *[sc, hdc] in next st, [dc, tr, dc] in next st, [hdc, sc, sl st] in next st (see Step 5).

Rep from * seven more times (8 petals).

Rnd 7: With Color B and working in back loops of Rnd 5, ch 2, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] all around. Join with sl st in front loop of first dc (see Step 6). (36 dc)


Rnd 8: With Color B and working through both loops of each st, ch I, *[sc, hdc] in next st, [dc, tr, dc] in next st, [hdc, sc, sl st] in next st (see Step 7).

Rep from * II more times (I2 petals).

Rnd 9: With Color A, ch 3, sl st in first sc of Rnd 8. Sl st in each st (see Step 8).

Fasten off both colors. Weave in ends.









Rnds I-4: Follow pattern and chart for Rnds I-4 of "Small flower."

Rnd 5: Working in back loops only of Rnd 3: ch I, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] six times. Join Rnd with sl st in front loop of first sc. (18 sts)

Rnd 6: Working into front loops only of Rnd 5: [ch 4, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch, sl st in next sc] 18 times.

Fasten off Color A.

Seed head:

In Color D, [ch 6, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch] six times, sl st in first ch to create circle (see Steps 8–9).

Fasten off Color D. Weave in ends.

Attach Color E to last sl st.

Ch 12, sl st in 5th ch from hook.

Fasten off Color E. Weave in ends (see Steps IO-II).

Leaf:

Row I: In Color B, ch 20, starting with 6th ch from hook, hdc in next 13 ch, sc in next 2 ch.

Fasten off Color B.

Attach Color C.

Row 2: Ch 2, sc in first 2 sc of Row I, [ch 2, tr in next hdc, ch 2, sc in next 2 hdc] four times, hdc in next hdc, [2 dc, 3 tr, 3 ch picot, 3 tr, 2 dc] in ch-5 loop, hdc in next ch, sc in next 2 ch, [ch 2, tr in next ch, ch 2, sc in next 2 ch] four times, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch (see Steps I2-I5). Fasten off Color C. Weave in all ends.

Stem and bud:

In Color C, ch 22.

Row I: 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (2 sc)

Row 2: Ch I, turn. 2 sc in each sc. (4 sc)


Rows 3–5: Ch I, turn, sc in each sc, sc along edge of flower, sl st in each ch.

Fasten off Color C at bottom of stem (see Step 16).

Attach Color A to first sc of Row 5.

Ch 4, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each st, sl st in same sc, [ch 4, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each st, sl st in next sc] three times, ch 4, starting from 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each st, sl st in same sc.

Fasten off Color A (see Step 17).





Flower: Make a dandelion flower by working 6 sc into a magic ring.



Working into the front loops only: Ch 3, sl st into each ch starting with the 2nd ch from the hook, sl st into the next sc.
Repeat this five times to make the first layer of six petals.



Fold the first layer of petals forward as pictured in order to crochet into the back loops of Round I.



Make a second layer of petals by crocheting into the front loops only of Round 3.



Fasten off Color A at this point for a small flower or follow the pattern for the large flower, by adding two more rounds.



You can make a 3D seed head by replacing the yellow yarn of the flower with brown yarn in Rounds I and 3 and white yarn in Rounds 2 and 4.



Seed head: You can also make flat seed heads separately, which work well for appliqué. In Color D, ch 6 then sl st in each ch starting from the 2nd chain from the hook.



Repeat Step 7 five times then sl st into the first ch to form the seed head into a circle. You could also use white instead of gray for this part.





Ch I2, then sl st into the 5th ch from the hook. You are now ready to weave in the ends using a yarn needle.



Weave the needle carefully through the wrong side of the seed head, as shown. Pull through to hide the yarn, then cut the ends.



Leaf: Follow the pattern to crochet the first row for the leaf in Color B, and then crochet around in Color C.




As you work Row 2, you will be crocheting small ridges along the leaf.



The 3 ch picot is located at the very tip of the leaf.



Continue to crochet around the leaf, finishing with a hdc and sc into the last 2 chain stitches.



Bud and stem: As you make the stem, sc along the bud part (indicated by the arrow) and then sl st all the way down the stem.



Attach Color A to the first sc of the previous row and follow the pattern to crochet the small petals of the bud.



34 Day Lily

This is a unique variety of lily, with frilly petals and beautiful contrasting colors. It is a bigger flower that will hold its shape nicely as a decoration for any accessory.



Pattern

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page I2).

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch 2, I2 dc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st (see Step I). (I2 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, [dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc] three times. Join rnd with sl st (see Step 2). (I5 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch I, [sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc] three times. Join rnd with sl st (see Step 3). (I8 sts)

Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B to first sc of Rnd 3.

Rnd 4: Ch I, *sc in first sc, [hdc, dc] in next hdc, [dc, 2 tr] in next dc, [2 tr, dc] in next dc, [dc, hdc] in next hdc, sc in next sc (see Step 4).

Rep from * twice more. Join rnd with sl st (see Steps 5–6). (36 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch I, *sc in first sc, hdc in next hdc, [hdc, dc] in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, [dc, tr] in next tr, 2 tr in next 2 tr, [tr, dc] in next tr, 2 dc in next dc, [dc, hdc] in next dc, hdc in next hdc, sc in next sc. Rep from * twice more. Join rnd with sl st. (60 sts) Fasten off Color B (see Step 7).

Attach Color B to the wrong side of the first petal, as shown in **Step 8**.

Rnd 6: [Ch IO, sl st behind next petal] three times (see Steps 9-IO).

Rnd 7: Ch 2, [IO dc in ch IO loop] three times. Join rnd with sl st (see Steps II-I2). (30 sts)

Rnd 8: Ch I, *sc in next 2 dc, hdc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next 2 dc (see Step I3).

Rep from * twice more. Join rnd with sl st. (36 sts)

Rnd 9: Ch I, *sc in next 2 sc, hdc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next dc, [dc, tr] in next dc, [tr, dc] in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sc (see Step I4).

Rep from * twice more. Join rnd with sl st. (48 sts) Fasten off Color B (see Step I5).

Attach Color A to the last round of the top layer of petals.

[Ch 3, sl st in next st] all around (see Step I6). Fasten off Color A and weave in all ends.

Stamens:

In Color A, [ch I2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next IO ch] three times.

Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B to last sl st.

[Ch I2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next IO ch] twice.

Fasten off Color B (see Step 17).

Attach stamens to the middle of the flower.

Weave in all ends.



To begin your flower, follow the pattern for Round I.

Change to Color B and follow the pattern for Round 4, establishing the petal shape, as shown.



The pattern repeats three times—once for each petal.



Use a stitch marker to help you identify the first stitch of the round. It is very important to keep a good stitch count.



After Round 5, fasten off Color B. The flower will look like this.




The arrow indicates where you should attach Color B to begin Round 6.



9 From here, ch IO.



The arrows show where the sl sts are made at the end of each ch IO loop in Round 6.







After Round 7, the flower will look like this from the back.



Follow the pattern for Rounds 8 and 9, using the photographs and chart for reference.



The second layer of petals will be aligned perfectly to peek out from behind the top layer of petals.



Fasten off Color B as you complete Round 9.



Attach Color A to the top layer of petals, as shown, and work [ch 3, sl st in next st] all the way around to make a fringe.



Follow the pattern to make stamens in both colors and sew to the center of the flower to complete.





35 Pansy

These flowers are a staple in any flower bed. They are so bright and colorful too, so you can't go wrong with the color choice. Use your imagination.



Ch 2, 2 hdc in ch-2 loop, hdc in next hdc, dc in

Fasten off Color B.

Attach Color C to ch-6 loop behind first petal (see Step 6).

Rnd 5: *Ch 2, [2 dc, 7 tr, 2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in ch-6 loop.


Rep from * in next ch-6 loop (see Step 7).

Follow **Step 8** to embroider the stamens to the flower in Color D.







PROJECT I

Forget-Me-Not Bracelet and Headband

Skill level:



This simple project is very easy to make and follow: Ideal for your first crochet project. By joining individually made small flowers, you will create a string of flowers that can be made into a bracelet or a headband. The headband is onesize-fits-all—you can adjust the length using the ties. Why not experiment with the flowers and yarn to create different accessories?

Pattern:

Bracelet

First flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring] six times. Six petals in total. Fasten off.

Second flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, sl st in dc of first flower, ch 2, sl st in ring] twice.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring] four times. Six petals in total. Fasten off.

Add three more flowers following the second flower instructions.

Sixth flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, sl st in dc of fifth flower, ch 2, sl st in ring] twice.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, sl st in dc of first flower, ch 2, sl st in ring] twice.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring. Six petals total. Fasten off.

Headband

First flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 60, [2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in 3rd ch from hook, sl st in each ch until you reach petal, sl st in dc, ch 2, sl st in ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring] four times.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 60, [2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in 3rd ch from hook, sl st in each ch until you reach petal, sl st in dc, ch 2, sl st in ring. Six petals in total, and two long ties. Fasten off.

Second flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, sl st in dc of previous flower, ch 2, sl st in ring] twice.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring] four times. Six petals in total. Fasten off.

Add II more flowers following the second flower instructions.

Fourteenth flower:

Ch 6. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 60, [2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in 3rd ch from hook, sl st in each ch until you reach petal, sl st in dc, ch 2, sl st in ring.


Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring.

[Ch 2, dc in ring, sl st in dc of thirteenth flower, ch 2, sl st in ring] twice.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring.

Ch 2, dc in ring, ch 60, [2 dc, ch 2, sl st] in 3rd ch from hook, sl st in each ch until you reach petal, sl st in dc, ch 2, sl st in ring. Six petals in total, and two long ties.

Fasten off. Weave in all ends.



PROJECT 2

Floral Placemat



Add a splash of color to your kitchen! Using the Chaenomeles Japonica flower pattern (see pages 68-69), combine your favorite colors to create a beautiful placemat. You can stick to the suggested size or change the number of flowers to make a coaster or add more flowers for a stunning table runner.

Pattern:

With Color A, make a magic ring (see page 12).

Rnd I: Into magic ring, ch I, 6 sc. Pull on short end to close middle. Join rnd with sl st. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, 3 dc in each sc. (18 dc)

Rnd 3: [Ch 5, skip 2 dc, sl st in next dc] six times.

Fasten off Color A.

Attach Color B to one of the ch-5 loops.

Petal I:

Row I: Ch I, 6 sc in ch-5 loop. (6 sc)

Row 2: Ch I, turn, sc in each sc.

Row 3: Ch I, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog. (4 sc)

Row 4: Ch I, turn, [sc2tog] twice. (2 sc)

Row 5: Ch I, turn, sc2tog. (I sc)

Do not turn. 6 sc around the side of the petal until you reach ch loop.

Make petals 2-6 in the same way as petal I.

12 sc evenly along edges of each petal.

Fasten off Color B.

For the second flower and each subsequent flower, you will be connecting to the previous flower as you go. When you sc around each petal, stop at the top of the petal, make a sl st into the middle of the petal of the connecting flower, then continue crocheting around the petals. Connect the next petal the same way with a sl st. Continue connecting each subsequent flower as you go in the same way, following the diagrams at right.



PROJECT 3

Gerbera Garden Pillowcase

Skill level:

Fully crochet a pillowcase that has flowers front and back, creating a perfect focal piece to decorate your living room couch or bedroom. This is a great "take along" project, you can take a few colors with you at a time, and crochet on the go.

Pattern:

Front flowers (make 9): Follow the exact pattern for Gerbera flower on pages 82–83.

Back flowers (make I2): Follow the pattern for Gerbera flower on pages 82–83 but skip Round 3, and make the whole flower in one color.

Do not fasten off yarn.

To connect flowers:

Flower I:

Rnd I: SI st in top of petal, *[ch 5, sI st in top of next petal] four times, [ch 8, sI st in next petal] twice.

Rep from * three more times.

Rnd 2: Sl st to middle of loop, [ch 5, sl st in next loop]

four times, ch 8, sl st in next loop.

*[Ch 5, sl st in next loop] five times, ch 8, sl st in next loop. Rep from * twice more. Ch 5, sl st in first sl st. Fasten off.

Flowers 2-9:

The second flower will be attached to the first one as you go.

Rnd I: As Rnd I above.

Rnd 2: Non-connecting side(s): Sl st in middle of loop, [ch 5, sl st in next loop] four times.

Connecting side(s): Ch 4, sl st in ch-8 loop of connecting


flower, ch 4, sl st in next loop. [Ch 2, sl st in next loop of connecting flower, ch 2, sl st in next loop] five times. Ch 4, sl st in ch-8 loop of connecting flower, ch 4, sl st in next loop.

*[Ch 5, sl st in next loop] five times, ch 8, sl st in next loop. Rep from * once more. Ch 5, sl st in first sl st. Fasten off.







PROJECT 4

Landscape Market Bag



This is a bigger project, but don't be afraid to tackle it. A good rule to follow to avoid getting overwhelmed about a pattern, is to take it one step at a time, without trying to understand the whole concept at once. Soon you will see it unfolding nicely in your hands.

Materials:

Fingering weight yarn in 6 colors:

Color A: 200 yds (183 m)

Color B: 200 yds (183 m)

Color C: 200 yds (183 m)

Color D: 200 yds (183 m)

Color F: 100 yds (91.5 m)

Color E: 100 yds (91.5 m)

Pattern:

Flowers (Part I):

The flowers in this pattern are based on the Harlequin pattern (see pages 46-47), with a few changes.

Ch IO. Sl st in first ch to make a ring.

Rnd I: Ch 2, 24 dc in ring. Join rnd with sl st in first dc of rnd. (24 dc)

Rnd 2: [Ch I5, skip next dc, sl st in next 2 dc] seven times, ch 15, skip next dc, sl st in next dc.

Rnd 3: *[3 hdc, 7 dc, ch 2, 7 dc, 3 hdc] in 15-ch loop, sc in sl st between petals.

Rep from * seven more times (8 petals).

Fasten off Color A.

Follow the pattern above to make six flowers, three in Color A and three in Color B. Connect them with sl sts into the tips of the flower petals: Follow the diagram for connecting sl st placement.

Bag (Part 2):

Lay the flowers flat. Work as below, starting from the top right-hand petal of any flower.

Attach Color C to top of the petal.

Rnd I: Ch 2, *3 dc in ch-2 loop at top of petal, ch 9, 3 dc in top of next petal, ch 21, 3 dc in connection between flowers, ch 9, sl st in 9th ch from top of last 3 dc, ch 12. Rep from * five more times. Join with sl st in first dc of rnd.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, *skip 3 dc, dc in next 3 ch, skip 3 ch, dc in next 3 ch, [skip 3 dc, dc in next 3 ch] twice, skip 3 ch, 3 dc in sl st, [skip 3 ch, dc in next 3 ch] twice.

Rep from * five more times. Join with sl st in first dc of rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, *skip 3 dc, 3 dc in space before next dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc of rnd.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, *skip 3 dc, 2 dc in space before next dc, ch 2.

Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc.

Rnds 5-7: Ch 3, *2 dc in next ch-2 loop, ch 2.

Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc.

Rnd 8: Ch 3, *dc in next ch-2 loop, ch 3.

Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc.

Rnd 9: Ch 3, *dc in next ch-3 loop, ch 3.

Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc.

Fasten off Color C.

Attach Color D and rep Rnds 2-9.

Fasten off Color D.

Attach Color E and rep Rnds 2-5.

Fold bag to make sure flowers are aligned. Sc along the bottom of the bag, through both sides, to close the bottom of the bag. Fasten off Color E.

Handle (Part 3):

Rotate bag 180 degrees and attach Color F to the top-right petal of the right-hand flower on the opposite side. Repeat Rnds I-3 above.

Rnd 4: Follow instructions for Rnd 3, until you reach the top-left petal of the right-hand flower. Ch 93. Skip all sts until the top-right petal of the left-hand flower. Use the diagram on the right as a guide. Continue Rnd 3 to end. Join with sl st in first dc.

Rnd 5: Ch 3, *skip 3 dc, 3 dc in space before next dc. Rep from * to ch.

*[Dc in next 3 ch, skip 3 ch] to last 3 ch, dc in next 3 ch. Rep from * once more. [Skip 3 dc, 3 dc in space before next dc] to end of rnd. Join with sl st.

Rnd 6: Ch 3, *skip 3 dc, 3 dc in space before next dc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first dc.

Fasten off Color F and weave in all ends.






Ch IO, sl st in first ch to make ring.

Rnd I: Ch 2, 24 dc in ring. Join rnd with sl st. (24 dc)

Rnd 2: [Ch IO, skip 2 dc, sl st in next 2 dc] six times.

six times.

Rnd 3: [2 sc, 3 hdc, 3 dc, 2 tr, 3 ch picot, 2 tr, 3 dc, 3 hdc, 2 sc] in each ch-IO loop. Fasten off.

Make seven flowers in each of Colors A, B, C, and D.

To join flowers:

Arrange flowers into desired pattern.

Starting from tip of a flower petal, attach Color E.

[Ch II, sl st in next 3 ch picot] six times. Join rnd with sl st.


Ch 2, [II dc in next ch-II loop, ch 6, II dc in same ch-II loop, ch 6] six times. Join rnd with sl st.

Fasten off for first flower.

For next flower, repeat from start. At each joining point (refer to chart at right) ch 2, sl st in ch-6 loop, ch 2.

Continue connecting flowers together.

Weave in all ends.

Color E: 600 yds (549 m)




