## Half Square Triangle Hybrid Crochet Quilt



PATTERN Materials:

Any light DK scrap yarn in warm tones, pinks, reds, yellows, and oranges. You will need approximately 5 yards per color.

Any light DK scrap yarn in cool tones, blues, greens, aqua, teal, and purples. You will need approximately 5 yards per color.

Light DK scraps of several shades of grey.

2-3 balls of DK light white yarn. In mine I have used both Stylecraft DK and Paintbox DK.

Size H 4mm crochet hook

Tapestry needle

Round 1: With a warm color, make a magic ring and Ch 3, work 2 Dc into the magic ring Ch 2, 3 Dc into magic ring, Ch 1, change color to a different warm color (drop the other yarn, we will pick it up later), Ch 1, 3 Dc into magic ring, Ch 2, 3 Dc into the magic ring, Ch 1, sl st into top single strand of initial Ch 3, turn, sl st into Ch space

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts here as a Dc), Dc into Ch space, Dc across to next corner Ch space, (2 Dc, Ch 2, 2 Dc) into Ch space, Dc across to next corner Ch space, (2 Dc, Ch 1) into Ch space, pick up the other warm color yarn (drop the warm color you are using yarn), (Ch 1, 2 Dc) into same Ch space to complete the corner cluster, Dc across to next corner Ch space, (2 Dc, Ch 2, 2 Dc) into Ch space, Dc across to next corner Ch space, (2 Dc, Ch 1) into last Ch space, sl st to top just one strand of initial Ch 3, turn, sl st into Ch space

Rounds 3-4: Repeat Round 2

Round 5: repeat round 4, but do only 1 ch1 in the open corner spaces


Finish off, weave inner ends, but leave tails 8-10 inches for sewing together.

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Cool would be blues, greens, darker shades of purple, and teals.

Warm would be reds, pinks, yellows, and oranges.


Greys would be varying shades.


White is the same throughout.

Each block is the same with varying colors.





My Crochet Version








2. Sew the top 2 together and the bottom 2 together then sew to the four in step 1.














8. Sew the side strips on.



9. The Blocks are sewn together by sewing the first and second 2 together, then sewing the panels together.



10. This is 4 blocks. Each block using the same color layout. Mine has a different color layout as far as shades, but keping the cools with the cools and warms with the warms.



This is what 8 panels might look like with maybe a black, white, and grey border.
